Community Updates & Improvements



NEW ELECTRONIC MONUMENT SIGN INSTALLED

You may have noticed the new electronic sign welcoming motorists into Rowland Heights on the south side of Colima Road east of Nogales Street. The construction of the sign that includes a community message board, was recently completed and will help enhance the dissemination of important County information to passing motorists in your community.

GRAFFITI TRACKER CATCHES VANDALS IN THE ACT

A high-tech system designed to curb graffiti is credited for an arrest of a local man accused of several incidents of graffiti vandalism in the Rowland Heights area. Los Angeles County Sheriff's Deputies, using documentation obtained from the "Graffiti Tracker" program, recently arrested one of the most active graffiti vandals in Rowland Heights. The suspect was arrested and charged with multiple misdemeanor counts of vandalism, and is currently awaiting trial. Since then, there have been criminal filings against two additional suspects.

Before the "Graffiti Tracker," an arrest like this would not have been possible because there was no way of determining which vandals were doing the most damage or how much damage they were actually responsible for. The "Graffiti Tracker" system was created to capture and store graffiti data. The system gives law enforcement personnel real-time, street-level intelligence that allows them to not only focus on the worst graffiti offenders and their damage, but also to monitor potential gang violence that is associated with the graffiti.

ROWLAND HEIGHTS MILITARY RECOGNITION BANNER PROGRAM

To honor the dedicated service of Rowland Heights residents proudly serving in the United States Armed Forces, the Board Office and the San Gabriel Valley Regional Chamber of Commerce began displaying recognition banners along major streets of the community.

The "Heights Military Recognition Banner Program" seeks to honor active military personnel by having a banner in their name prominently displayed on utility and light poles. Residents of Rowland Heights who are on active duty are eligible to participate in the program and receive a banner. The first group of approximately 54 banners was installed last year and will be left up indefinitely. JELICK DIGITAL LITERACY CENTER AND LIBRARY OPENS!

A grand opening ceremony was held on March 7th to celebrate the new Digital Learning Center at Jellick Elementary School. A \$132,000 grant from the County of Los Angeles will enable students and their families to access 20 laptop computers and a variety of software. All computers have access to the Internet and printers. A Community Laptop Program allows residents to check out a computer after completion of 12 hours of computer training. At the ceremony, Jellick kindergarteners performed for the crowds and members of the community read to students in celebration of Read Across America Week.

The grant also funded an extensive multilingual book section for the school's new Wonder of Reading Library, where adult and children's books are available in English, Spanish, Korean and Chinese. According to Jellick Principal Helene Zimmerman, "Being literate is more than the ability to read and comprehend a book; it is the ability to access and share information in our global world."



MANAGING LOCAL TRAFFIC SIGNALS WILL OFFER SMOOTHER TRAFFIC FLOW

Rowland Heights will add 34 traffic signals on Nogales Street, Fairway Drive, Colima Road, and Fullerton Road to the County's central traffic management system. The traffic management system will allow the traffic engineers to analyze troubled areas for timing improvements and alert maintenance staff to intersection malfunctions for faster response.

Additionally, the Nogales Street Traffic Signal Synchronization Project will include design and construction of synchronization improvements on Nogales Street. Traffic signals will be upgraded to include a vehicle detector in the pavement that will detect the presence of vehicles, coordinate the timing of the signals between intersections, and automatically adjust the signals to move vehicles through the intersections more efficiently. Construction will begin in 2009.

Upgrades to Your Local Parks

GRAND OPENING HELD FOR CAROLYN ROSAS PARK COMMUNITY FITNESS CENTER

A grand opening celebration was held in March 2008 to commemorate the completion of the new 2,500-square-foot facility constructed adjacent to the existing community building. New to the park is a fitness room, kitchen, restrooms, storage areas, and an office. The project complements the existing outdoor activity areas with a new, 1,700-square-foot outdoor exercise area and landscaping for tai-chi and other aerobic activities. BILL BLEVINS PARK

Children of all ages will enjoy the new playground equipment scheduled for installation at Blevins Park. The construction is expected to be completed early Summer 2008.

ROWLAND HEIGHTS PARK

New playground equipment was installed that now meets the standards of the American with Disabilities Act. One structure was built for kids ages 2 to 5 years and a larger structure for kids ages 5 to 12 years. The new playground equipment features a 12-foot slide, a galaxy structure for upper body strength and a spinner.

SCHABARUM COUNTY PARK PROJECT

The 589-acre Schabarum Regional County Park will undergo three refurbishment projects in 2008. Look forward to the new rest area for equestrians along the multi-use trail on the east end of the park in Summer 2008. The rest area will be landscaped and include hitching posts and watering stations. Also, new play area equipment is scheduled to be installed in early Summer 2008. Pedestrian bridges along with two vehicle bridges will also be refurbished and are scheduled to be completed early Winter 2008.

New Law Regarding Cell Phone Use in California Takes Effect July 1, 2008

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health reminds you that effective July 1, 2008, California law will:

- **Prohibit the use of "hand-held" cell phones** among drivers 18 years and older, except for emergency calls to law enforcement and public safety agencies, and for certain commercial vehicles for which the law's effective date is July 1, 2011.
- **Prohibit a driver under the age of 18 years** from using ANY wireless device, even if equipped with a hands-free or mobile service device, except during an emergency.

Digital Television

In less than a year, the country will change the way it sends television signals. Your TV signal is switching to "digital." After February 17, 2009, most of the old analog signals will be gone and most of the stations will use only the new digital signals.

What does this mean to you?

- If all of your TVs are hooked up to cable or satellite, you will continue to get your TV after the switch. Check with your cable or satellite company to be sure.
- If you have digital TV, you are ready for the switch. If your TV is more than 10 years old it probably is not digital. If it is less than 10 years old, ask the manufacturer if your TV is "analog-only."
- If you have an analog-only TV with a roof top antenna or "rabbit ears," you will need to purchase a converter box.

On Tuesday, August 21, 2007, the Los Angeles County Fire Department responded to a brush fire in Hacienda Heights. Approximately 100 acres burned and over 300 firefighters responded. Fortunately, there were no injuries or loss of property.


The Los Angeles County Fire Department will begin annual residential brush inspections, starting May 1, 2008. Please follow these simple tips:

- Remove flammable vegetation and other combustible growth within 30 feet of any structures.
- Landscape using drought-tolerant and fire-resistant plants.
- Space trees and shrubs a minimum of 15 feet apart (or three times their diameter) from other shrubs.
- Remove dead branches, leaves and all stacks of combustible materials.
- Stack wood at least 30 feet from structures.
- Remove flammable vegetation within 10 feet of wood piles.

Coyotes are often sighted in Rowland Heights. There are important precautions to take to discourage coyote visits to your property:

- Never leave small children unattended in areas where coyotes are known to be, even in your yard.
- Keep small pets indoors. Keep pet food indoors or promptly remove dishes when pets complete their meal outside.
- Outdoor lights with motion sensors may keep coyotes from your property at night.
- Clear brush and dense weeds from around your property; this deprives rodents of shelter and reduces cover for coyotes who search for rodents for food.
- Maintain trash cans with secure lids that will not open if tipped over. Put trash out the morning of pick-up.
- Do not feed or provide water for coyotes or other wildlife. It is against the law to feed coyotes.

Adopt a Pet

Adoption fees for first time adoptions are \$33 for cats and \$38 for dogs. Fees include the pets' initial vaccinations, spay/neutering costs, and microchips.

Every Pet Owner is Required to Follow These Laws:

- **The Leash Law** - it is not permitted to let your dog run loose day or night, with or without a license.
- **Rabies Vaccination Requirements** - rabies vaccinations must be kept current for all dogs and cats.
- **Annual Licensing Requirements** - a license tag must be purchased annually for dogs and cats and secured to their collar.
- **Provide Animals Proper Shelter** - animals must have access to shelter from rain and sun at all times.
- **Provide Animals Food and Water** - failing to provide an animal with adequate food or water is punishable by the State Penal Code.
- **Transportation of Animals** - it is not permissible to transport any dog in the back or bed of any open truck or other open vehicle while traveling on a County road, street, highway, lane or alley.
- **Anti-Tethering** - With few exceptions, no person shall tether, fasten, chain, tie, or restrain, a dog to a tree, fence, dog house or any other stationary object.
- **Mandatory Spay/Neuter & Microchip Ordinance** - All dogs must be spayed or neutered and microchipped unless the pet is qualified for an "exemption."

Business owners should do the following before signing a lease for commercial space:

1. Verify that your business is a permitted use based on the property zoning.
2. Check with Regional Planning to verify whether there are any zoning violations in the center. Regional Planning cannot accept or approve your application until all violations have been abated at the location.
3. Verify that there is sufficient parking in the center and whether your business will require additional parking. If the parking needs from existing legal businesses already reach or exceed the number of parking spaces allowed, you need to obtain additional approvals from Regional Planning.

Any of these issues may delay opening your business even if you have already signed your lease with the property owner. To protect your interests, contact Regional Planning before you sign your lease.

The Department of Public Works (DPW) administers the street lighting program which is funded through property tax assessments. Southern California Edison (SCE) installs the street lights and responds to maintenance calls. Upon receipt of a street lighting request, DPW will:


- Determine if your area is part of an existing County Lighting District.
- If you are not in the district, DPW will prepare a petition for a community member to circulate among the affected property owners. Annual assessments are \$5 per single-family homes, with higher rates for other land uses.
- Once the petition is signed by at least 60% of the property owners and verified by DPW, an engineer's report and a formal ballot proceeding is initiated. The ballots are then sent out to the property owners within the petition area. If a majority of the weighted ballots are returned in opposition to being part of the district, then the proceeding is terminated. Otherwise, the territory becomes part of the lighting district and street lights are generally installed by SCE within 4 to 6 months.
