Altadena Town Council, your local forum to voice community concerns


The Altadena Town Council consists of Altadena residents like yourselves who are elected to hear input from local residents and make recommendations to your elected officials and County staff. The Council was established in 1975 to serve as a forum for residents to express their needs, concerns, and to reach consensus on various issues. The Council in turn, expresses those views to the County and makes recommendations on the issues that may affect your community. There are 16 councilmembers, two from each of the eight census tracts in Altadena, who are elected to alternating two-year terms. If you have issues in your neighborhood, please contact your Council representative. The only way the Council can most effectively relay your views to your elected officials and the County is by becoming aware of your concerns or issues.

The Town Council conducts its general meetings on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. at the Altadena Community Center (730 E. Altadena Drive). In addition to the general meetings, the Traffic Committee meets on the 1st Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. at the Community Center, and the Land Use Committee meets on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. at the Community Center.



Discover Brainfuse, a Free Program For Students and Adults!

With your Altadena Library Card, you can access Brainfuse, which is a provider of one-on-one online tutoring for both students (grades 3-12) and adults. Brainfuse offers tutoring in math, science, social studies, and English/language arts, daily from 1:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. Students communicate with live tutors using an interactive whiteboard to chat, write, draw, copy/paste text or images, and graph homework problems. Writing instructors also help by providing feedback and assistance within 24 hours of receiving a written submission. Students can also take practice standardized tests (SAT, ACT, etc.) and share the results with tutors for targeted skills assistance. Adults can receive live online help from trained adult education specialists in areas such as US Citizenship testing, high school equivalency preparation, resume/cover letter writing, MS Office, and career resources.

The Cobb Estate and Sam Merrill Trail to Echo Mountain

Located at the top of Lake Avenue is the Cobb Estate which is operated by the United State Forest Service. At Cobb Estate, hikers can take the Sam Merrill Trail about three miles up to Echo Mountain, where the Mt. Lowe Railway once shuttled Victorian vacationers up and down the mountainside to the tourist destination. The site once boasted a 70-room hotel, dance hall, observatory, petting zoo, casino and tavern, among other attractions.

To get to the Sam Merrill Trail, keep walking east from the main paved entrance; you'll see a sign and maps marking the trail. The uphill hike takes about two hours (water and snacks recommended!), and once you're there, you can keep hiking another two miles on the Castle Canyon Trail to Inspiration Point. If you plan on checking it out during these

hot summer days, it's recommended to get out there early before the sun comes out ablazing in the afternoon.

Altadena Mountain Rescue Team (AMRT)

The AMRT is a nonprofit volunteer organization dedicated to saving lives through mountain rescue and safety education. Headquartered at the Altadena Station, the team is staffed by reserve deputies and is operational 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The team conducts weekend patrols of the mountain areas within its jurisdiction, namely the 20 canyons behind Altadena.

Established in 1951, the AMRT is the oldest organization of its kind in Los Angeles County. On average, the AMRT assists approximately 100 lost or injured hikers and conducts almost 40 searches and rescues every year. In addition to those rescues within LA County, the team has also participated in rescue operations throughout California, and in New York, Hawaii, and Mexico.



AMRT volunteer members come from all walks of life and have included police officers, firemen, paramedics, teachers, lawyers, registered nurses, construction contractors, chiropractors, mechanical and electrical engineers, and more.


Eaton Canyon Upper Falls Closure

With the support of several agencies, including the Fire Department, the Angeles National Forest decided to close access to the upper falls in the Eaton Canyon Natural Area because hikers have been injured and several have died. Over the years, hikers have found themselves in dangerous situations along the unauthorized path and subsequently called for help putting first responders in challenging and dangerous circumstances. The hike is steep and narrow and the terrain is made of crumbling rock and sediment with minimal space to walk or hang on to secure surfaces. In order to rescue climbers, helicopter crews would sometimes be required to fly dangerously close to power lines navigating hazardous conditions. Firefighters and first responders had to carefully repel down to assist or retrieve the injured, and repel back up avoiding cliffs and live-wires. Many agencies responded with helicopters, Search and Rescue Teams, trucks, and engines, incurring costs and unnecessary risk to those involved in the rescues.

The Eaton Canyon Natural Area remains open to visitors with numerous other hiking trails. Hikers are encouraged to speak with the Park Staff and review maps to ensure their safety before they begin hiking. Visit www.ecnca.org for more information.

Learn to Save Lives with Hands-Only CPR!

Throughout LA County, the Fire Department offers many opportunities to get trained in Hands-Only CPR which is a new, easy way for you to provide lifesaving Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) to anyone who goes into sudden cardiac arrest. Hands-Only CPR uses chest compressions only – no mouth to mouth – to save lives in the first few minutes before help arrives.



During National CPR Week (June 1-7), a free Countywide training event called "Sidewalk CPR Day" takes place at dozens of community hotspots with your local firefighters and medical professionals teaching citizens how to save a

life with Hands-Only CPR in just five minutes. There is also the CPR Anytime Program in which middle and high school students are given a training kit to take home and train family members and friends how to perform CPR. 

Property Tax Saving Programs Homeowners' Exemption

If you own and occupy your home as your principal place of residence, you may be eligible for a Homeowners' Exemption that reduces your property tax by about \$70 annually.

Disabled Veterans' Exemption

A veteran who is rated 100% disabled due to a service-connected disability, or the unmarried surviving spouse of certain deceased veterans, may be eligible for a Disabled Veterans' Property Tax Exemption.

Decline-in-Value

Proposition 8, a constitutional amendment passed in 1978, allows a temporary reduction in assessed value when a property suffers a decline-in-value. A decline-in-value occurs when the current market value of real property is less than the current assessed (taxable) value as of January 1.

The Works is a mobile app available on Apple iOS and Android devices, which allows County residents to report and request services. With the most recent update, residents can now interact with the Departments of Parks and Recreation, Public Health, and Regional Planning on certain issues in addition to the Department of Public Works. 
New LA County Trails Website!

The LA County Department of Parks and Recreation has launched a new website, trails.lacounty.gov, dedicated to information about trails throughout Los Angeles County. The website provides hikers, mountain bikers, and equestrians with detailed, regularly-updated information to help you navigate the most scenic pathways in the region. At launch, the site will cover 367 miles of trails that have been GPS-mapped and collected into a GIS database including trails maintained by the National Park Service, U.S. Forest Service, California State Parks, Mountains Restoration Trust, Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy, and Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority. This mobile-friendly website will allow you to:



- Access a comprehensive list of trails that includes such information as trail conditions, directions, length, and elevation gain.
- View interactive maps that show trail steepness and surface type.
- Download QuickGuides of trails that include trail maps, descriptions, and directions.

A LA County Trails mobile app and expanded trail signage program are due in 2015.
