



GOING W.I.L.D.

A group of teens representing Loma Alta Park were among 100 high school students who took part in the Wildlife Inspired Leadership Development (W.I.L.D.) 4 Nature summer program's expedition to Catalina Island. The three-day, two-night journey helped the participating teens discover personal strengths and gain confidence through leadership training and connections to nature by focusing on habitat preservation and environmental stewardship. The location, at Camp Emerald Bay on Catalina's undeveloped west end, provided participants with access to the natural gems of the island's ecosystem. Among the most impactful parts of the program was an environmental service project to assist with the removal of an invasive species that threatens Catalina's delicate ecosystem.

As a result of the trip, the W.I.L.D. 4 Nature youth from Loma Alta Park were inspired to meet as a group to plan, develop, and create meaningful environmental service projects for their local park and all of Altadena.





Stop Signs With Light Emitting Diodes (LED)

In an effort to improve safety at stop sign-controlled intersections, some cities and counties in the United States have installed stop signs enhanced with light emitting diodes (LEDs) at selected intersections. The hope is that if stop signs are made more noticeable with the flashing lights, the frequency of crashes will be reduced.

In February 2015, the LA County Board of Supervisors approved a pilot program on the use and effectiveness of these devices at selected intersections within various communities including Altadena. Two intersections in Altadena were selected for the County’s Pilot Program. These intersections are **Santa Rosa Avenue at Altadena Drive** and **Allen Avenue at Altadena Drive**. The LED stop signs which will be powered by solar power are expected to be installed in winter 2016. After the signs are installed, the Department of Public Works will collect traffic data for the next two years to determine the effectiveness of the device and also develop selection criteria for future installation of such devices.

The LA County Board of Supervisors recently approved an ordinance amending the County Code to require mandatory spay/neuter and microchipping of cats in the unincorporated areas of the County. The goal is to reduce the births of unwanted kittens and reunite more cats brought into our animal care centers with their owners. Last year, only 1.6% of cats turned into our centers were reunited with their owners.



Prepare for El Niño!

- Tools (wrench, duct tape, fire extinguisher, sturdy gloves, whistle)
