"Circles of a Ripple" Civic Art Hacienda Heights Community Center and Park

Artist James Dinh created "Circles of a Ripple", an outdoor space at the new community center that uses the metaphor of water ripples and connects them to the land, the ecology, local history, and the present-future.

The outermost circle, "Circle of Land", was formed with earth left over during the community center's construction, symbolizing the Puente Hills. The landscape within the "Circle of Ecologies" evokes the chaparral landscape that once existed in Hacienda Heights and much of Southern California. Three California Sycamore trees were planted in the center where rain water is collected and infiltrates back into the ground. The "Circle of Time" is reflected on long curving benches constructed with a wood-textured finish, inspired by agricultural fruit crates. Residents donated old photos and documents that were reproduced onto porcelain panels and placed along the backrests creating a historical timeline of the development of Hacienda Heights including its agricultural heritage. The rich agricultural history of Hacienda Heights is also reflected in the brown-tinted walnut panels highlighting the Pre-Spanish era thru the 1910s, the orange citrus panels cover the era of the 1920s thru the 1930s, and the avocado green panels cover 1940 to the present. At the opening ceremony, the community wrote down wishes on "selfies" taken with an instant camera, and hung them on the trees within the "Circle of Wishes," which were then placed in a time capsule.

The outermost circle, "Circle of Land", was formed with earth left over during the community center's construction, symbolizing the Puente Hills. The Community Celebrates!

This past October, over 2,000 attendees celebrated as the new Hacienda Heights Community Center officially opened its doors to the public. The open house kicked off a weeklong celebration that included dance and musical performances, a food tasting, a western BBQ, tours of the new facility and more.



The grand opening of the \$21 million dollar project culminates a partnership between the County of Los Angeles, the Hacienda La Puente Unified School District, the Department of Parks and Recreation and the community.

The new center and park, built on the seven acre site of the former Hillgrove Elementary School, was designed based on community input and includes a state of the art 500 seat multi-purpose performing space which includes a stage, high tech sound and light system, scene shop, green room, and dressing rooms. This space can also be uniquely transformed into a banquet hall and



accommodate seating for up to 400. Other features within the center include a dance rehearsal room, an arts and crafts room that includes a pottery kiln, a computer lab, and a catering kitchen. The public can enjoy seven acres of outdoor space that includes an outdoor performance area, walking trails, fitness stations that includes a special apparatus for disabled individuals, a basketball court, children's play area, and lawn areas for outdoor gatherings and activities. A civic art project called "Circles of a Ripple" is also located on the site (see page 2). The construction was managed by the Community Development Commission of the County of Los Angeles which included sustainable technologies and designs creating an environmentally responsible addition to the community.



Schabarum Regional Park offers 640-acres of open space that includes picnic areas, youth camping, soccer and tennis and many other youth recreational opportunities. Exercise classes take place in the park every day of the week and are offered free of charge. There is a "Senior Life Trail" exercise area that is located near the entrance to the park.

Other special features of the park are the Ume tree grove, which blossoms in February, the Memorial Cherry Tree Path, blooming in March and April, and the Hummingbird and Butterfly Garden planted with native plants that specifically attract our winged friends. The remaining acreage of the park has been left in its natural state and is crisscrossed by hiking, biking and horse-back riding trails.







Living with the Urban Coyotes

Coyotes roam looking for food, particularly in the hills surrounding Hacienda Heights. You can discourage coyotes by:

- Clearing brush and dense weeds from around your property.
- Picking up fallen fruit and cover compost piles. Putting away bird feeders at night to avoid attracting rodents and other coyote prey.
- Maintaining trash cans with secure lids. Coyotes have been known to scavenge through the trash.
- Not feeding or leaving water for coyotes or other wild life. It is against the law to feed coyotes.
- Keeping small pets indoors. Keeping pet food indoors.
- Never leaving small children unattended in your yard.



Hands Only CPR – Help Can Save Lives




Nearly 1,000 people die across the country per day, because they were in need of immediate help and did not receive CPR until professional help arrived. The new form of CPR is hands only! The Fire Department is training the public on how to use Hands Only CPR as an easier and effective means to help those in immediate need. They are also promoting Pulse Point which is a lifesaving app

for the public who have been trained in Hands Only CPR-trained.

Pulse Point is a free smart device application (app). The most important feature of this application is that it sends Fire Department alerts out to mobile phone users who have been trained in Hands Only CPR, at the same time that dispatchers alert emergency crews. The app provides the location of the victim experiencing the sudden cardiac arrest. Pulse Point also provides direction to the nearest Automated External Defibrillator.

DPW administers street lights within the Unincorporated areas, and Southern California Edison maintains a majority of streetlights within these same areas. Before streetlights can be installed, the area must be annexated into a County Lighting District. The County prepares a petition; and residents must obtain the signatures from 60% of the effected property owners. Streetlights can be installed for free on wood poles, or at a cost for concrete poles with an annual assessment of \$5 dollars for a single family home.

Street lights will be installed at the following locations:

Orange Grove Avenue (west of Beech Hill Drive): Installation of one street light on the end of the cul-de-sac.

Matchleaf Avenue (south of Sigman Street): Installation of three street lights on concrete poles and removal of two street lights on wood poles.
