

Community Updates

Groundbreaking Ceremonies Held for Two Community Projects

Hacienda Heights Community and Recreation Center • 1234 Valencia Avenue



On May 2, 2013, the community celebrated a groundbreaking to mark the beginning of construction for the new Hacienda Heights Community and Recreation Center. The 7-acre site, which was the former site of Hillgrove Elementary School, will be leased by the Hacienda La Puente School District to the County of Los Angeles to construct a gathering place for the community. Plans include a multi-purpose area with a stage, prop/scene shop, green room, and dressing room that will accommodate performance style seating for up to 539 people, and banquet style seating for up to 400 people; a small multi-purpose room, arts and crafts room, computer room, and

catering kitchen. The surrounding park will include walking trails, fitness stations, BBQ areas, picnic tables, and lawn areas for outdoor music and activities. As part of the County's Civic Art Program, "Circles of a Ripple" will offer visitors an opportunity to relax and reflect around two old Linden Trees. The Community Center is scheduled to be completed in the Fall of 2014 and will be operated by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation.



Orange Grove Park



Local officials joined the community in the groundbreaking celebration for the future 5.5-acre Orange Grove Park. The County entered into a joint use agreement with the Hacienda La Puente Unified School District to develop the park. The community was involved during the planning and design stages

for the development of the \$4 million project

that includes a sundial entry plaza, shaded picnic areas, playgrounds, walking paths, an exercise course, restrooms, and a parking lot. Drought tolerant plants and trees will be sustained by irrigation controlled by a system designed to retain water onsite and direct runoff to bio-retention areas. Attendees enjoyed music by the Orange Grove Middle School Band and singing by the Steinmetz Park Tiny Tots with the backdrop of the Puente Hills in the background. The project is scheduled for completion in February 2014 and will be operated by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation.

Los Angeles County Budget - No Cuts, No Shortfall

Los Angeles County unveiled a no cuts, no deficit budget proposal for 2013-14, totaling \$24 billion. "Achieving a balanced budget is a notable accomplishment given the economic crisis without service reductions, layoffs, or furloughs," said Chief Executive Officer William T Fujioka. The proposed budget includes ongoing and one-time savings. Closure of the Puente Hills Landfill

On October 31, 2013, the Puente Hills Landfill will close for good. Final closure activities include constructing a cover and installing irrigation and landscaping which is expected to take 12 to 24 months to complete. The Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation will then offer passive recreation, such as hiking and horse trails for riding. The Landfill Citizens Advisory Committee, including members from Hacienda Heights, exchanges information on the closure and park planning. Cars for Sale on Public Streets

An increase in vehicles for sale parked on public streets has resulted in a negative impact on residents and businesses. The Board of Supervisors adopted an ordinance prohibiting this activity on certain County streets. In Hacienda Heights; Clark Avenue and Gale Avenue will be posted with "No Parking" signs. Violators will be issued a parking citation and vehicles could be impounded. Hacienda Heights Loses a Hometown Hero

The Department of Defense announced the death of one of Hacienda Heights' hometown heroes, Army Specialist William J. Gilbert, 24. Specialist Gilbert died on May 14th, in Sanjaray, Afghanistan, of wounds suffered when enemy forces attacked his unit with an improvised explosive device. Specialist Gilbert was assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 41st Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 1st Armored Division, out of Fort Bliss, Texas. Specialist Gilbert was serving on his first combat tour as part of Operation Enduring Freedom. He received Basic Combat Training and Advanced Individual Training at Fort Benning, Georgia. Specialist Gilbert was awarded the National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal with a Campaign Star, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Army Service Ribbon, North Atlantic Treaty Organization Medal, the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Bronze Star and the Purple Heart. He is survived by his wife, Monica, who recently delivered their first child Mikayla, his mother-Jodi Gilbert, sister-Jessica Gilbert and extended family.





rats, Packrats, and even “Trade-rats,” are known for armoring their nests with stones, sticks, and cactus spines. (Dogs are welcome.)







If you are uninsured and between the ages of 19-64, you may be eligible for the Healthy Way L.A. no-cost health coverage program run by Los Angeles County. Coping with Coyotes

Coyotes are often sighted in Hacienda Heights. There are several steps you can take to discourage coyote visits on your property.

- Never leave small children unattended in your yard.
- Keep small pets indoors. Keep pet food indoors or promptly remove dishes when pets complete their meal outside.
- Clear brush and dense weeds from around your property. This discourages small rodents from gathering near your home and deprives coyotes of a meal.
- Maintain trash cans with secure lids. Coyotes have been known to scavenge through the trash.
- Pick up fallen fruit and cover compost piles.
- Put away bird feeders at night to avoid attracting rodents and other coyote prey.
- Do not feed or leave water for coyotes or other wildlife. It is against the law to feed coyotes.

Local firefighters have trained members of the public in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on the spot at the local Walmart and Steimetz Park. This program is part of the American Heart Association's "Hands Only CPR" effort to double the survival rate of victims of cardiac arrest and increase the skills of bystanders performing CPR.

Did you know?

- Nearly 300,000 Americans suffer sudden cardiac arrest, annually, in their homes or in public venues.
- On average, only 8% survive.
- CPR can more than triple the victim's chance of survival.

The Problem

Only 31% of victims receive CPR from a bystander outside of a hospital. Traditional CPR classes are approximately two hours long with very strict student to instructor ratios. The cost of training may discourage the average person that does not need the course for work purposes. It is a fact that 80% of all out-of-hospital cardiac arrests occur in the home and relatives are the most frequent witnesses.

The Solution

CPR Anytime participants are taught a "Hands Only CPR" version that only consists of compressions. This type of training had a better overall performance than those who were traditionally trained in a two-hour CPR course. Do not place trash containers at your curbside before 5:00 p.m. on the day before your scheduled collections or leave a container at your curb after 8:00 p.m. on the day of actual collection, or more than two hours after actual collection, whichever is later.
