COMING SOON! - THE HEIGHTS HOPPER - A New Public Shuttle Transportation System for Hacienda Heights!

A new shuttle service will begin operating soon that will increase mobility and connect you to County facilities located within your community. Funded by the Board of Supervisors, the Department of Public Works will oversee the implementation of the new shuttle system. A community poll resulted in the naming of the new shuttle, "The Heights Hopper". The fare will be 25 cents per trip and will be free for seniors (60 and older), children (under 5 years old), and persons with disabilities. The service is anticipated to begin in Fall 2016. Envision the Future! Puente Hills Landfill Park Master Plan Department of Parks and Recreation www.puentehillslandfillpark.org

Since the closure of the nation's second largest landfill, the County has been actively planning for the next phase of its use!

The closure of the Puente Hills Landfill presents an extraordinary opportunity to develop the land into a regional park that will offer trails, fitness activities, educational opportunities, and ways to experience stunning panoramic views. The landfill, which is owned by the Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County, will be designed and constructed into a park that will be managed by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation.

Re-purposing a Former Landfill Site into a Regional Park

The Department of Parks and Recreation hosted a series of four public workshops to gather input and develop concepts for the long-term vision of the future park. Community members from Hacienda Heights were in attendance and encouraged to “dream” in the first workshop, select from three park concepts in the second workshop, one of which was shaped into the “Preferred Park Concept” presented in the third workshop, with the “Final Park Concept” presented at the fourth workshop. The Final Park Plan includes a variety of recreational uses for all to enjoy.

Eastern Deck: 360 degree vistas will offer the opportunity for numerous overlooks including visual surprises from Downtown Los Angeles, to San Jose Creek, to the rooftops of Hacienda Heights with Mt. San Jacinto in the distance.

The Master Plan

As the Sanitation Districts winds down their closure activities, approximately 142 acres will be set aside as part of the Master Plan for park development. Park spaces, landscape and programming will be designed to be sensitive to wildlife and the adjacent nature preserve. Park improvements must remain adaptable in response to soil settling, which may be up to 125 feet in some areas over the next 30 years and beyond.

The existing Schabarum-Skyline Trail will be the recreational backbone of the future park, connecting to multi-use trails, equestrian trail staging areas, and a fitness running loop. Other recommended park elements include a visitor center, park entry plaza, scenic overlook, trail lift, performance space, picnic areas, dog park, bike skills area, stair climbs, slides, zip lines, and education and interpretive elements. Phase I of the project is anticipated to be completed by 2020.



The 45-day comment period for the Draft Environmental Impact Report will end on August 8, 2016. For more information log onto the park website at www.puentehillslandfillpark.org or contact Michelle O'Connor at the Department of Parks and Recreation at (213) 351-5121.



This 640-acre park offers picnic areas, youth camping, soccer, tennis; youth tennis lessons, and more. Free exercise classes take place every day, and a "Senior Life Trail" exercise area is available to everyone, and includes a one-mile walking-jogging path. An

equestrian boarding facility is located at the far south end of the park with access to trails. Picnic areas are available for rent, and the gazebo area is suitable for weddings, family reunions and corporate events. There are annual events including the Spring Festival held in March. Other features include an outdoor amphitheater, the Ume tree grove which blossoms in February, and the memorial Cherry tree path that blooms March through April. Visit the Hummingbird and Butterfly Garden planted with native plants that attract our winged friends. Concerts in the Park are held in the warm evenings of July (see page 5). The remaining areas have been left in their natural state with hiking, biking and horse-back riding trails.




The Hacienda Heights Trail Enforcement Program

The Los Angeles County trails that stretch through the southern portion of Hacienda Heights are regularly visited by residents from the surrounding communities. The pristine trail system and safe environment have attracted outdoor enthusiasts such as hikers, equestrians, cyclists, runners and naturalists for decades.



In response to the growing use of the local trails, the Board of Supervisors allocated funds to increase patrol by deputies. They recognized the need to continue to ensure the safety of the community which will preserve this peaceful environment. The deputies, in partnership with the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority Rangers who patrol adjoining trails, coordinate their patrol efforts.

This is the first time deputies have been specifically assigned to patrol trails, and it will serve as a pilot program for the entire County of Los Angeles. Los Angeles County's Emergency Notification System

Alert LA County is a free mass notification system for Los Angeles County's residents, schools and businesses. The system will contact you when an emergency or a critical situation happens.

Alert LA County is different from other services because the information comes from local authorities and is target specific. If the area where you live or have your business is impacted by an emergency or disaster, you will receive a recorded notification with specific directions on what to do. If your area is not threatened, you will not receive a notification.

How does the Alert LA County system contact you?

When you register, you can choose which option(s) you prefer. If there is an emergency or a disaster in your area, Alert LA County can contact you by sending you a:



Recorded telephone message at your home or business (TTY/TDD is also available)



Text message (SMS) or Email

Who should sign-up for Alert LA County?

All residents and businesses in Los Angeles County should sign-up to receive Alert LA County emergency notifications. The system has TTY/TDD capability if you are deaf or hearing impaired.

Hillside property owners are reminded that every year in the beginning of May until mid-June, the Fire Department conducts their annual brush clearance inspections in an effort to protect properties from the threat of wildfire. Fire personnel canvass the Hacienda Heights hillside areas and issue 30-day correction notices to property owners that are not in compliance with brush clearance requirements.


Remember to:

- Remove all flammable vegetation or other combustible growth within 30 feet, (50 feet in areas determined to be high fire hazard), of any structure.
- Thin out or remove other vegetation an additional 70 feet from the structure, (an additional 100 feet of thinning or removal may be required in high fire hazard areas).



New Regulations for Yard Sales Begin in Hacienda Heights

The Board of Supervisors adopted a new Yard Sale Ordinance Update for Unincorporated Areas of Los Angeles County. Features include:

- Limits yard sales to the last full weekend, (Saturday and Sunday only), of each month;
- Establishes a free registration process and allows two additional yard sales within a calendar year on non-designated weekends;
- Prohibits yard sales within the sidewalk, street, alley or other public rights-of-way.

To host a yard sale, download the form at planning.lacounty.gov/apps or register in person at the Public Works-Building and Safety Office located at: **16005 E. Central Avenue, La Puente, (626) 961-9611**. Bring proof of ownership of the residence at the location of the yard sale, (or copy of your lease, ID with current address, utility bill, or other official mail that lists the yard sale address).

Know Your Rights When Approached for House Number Curb Painting.

If approached by a solicitor who wants to paint your house number on the curb, be aware of the facts:

- The County does **not** employ anyone to paint house numbers on curbs.
- A solicitor **cannot** charge you for curb painting. You can volunteer to give a monetary donation.
- House number painters **must** obtain and carry a Solicitor's License from the Treasurer and Tax Collector and an Encroachment Permit from Public Works.
- The property owner's permission **must** first be obtained prior to any curb painting.
- Logos painted on the curb are **not** permitted in Hacienda Heights.
- The solicitor **must** provide you with a copy of the curb painting guidelines, obtain your signature and have been given permission to paint your curb.


