Living in Lennox

Lennox is located within unincorporated Los Angeles County. This means that Lennox is not a city, but is one of the many unincorporated communities in which the County is responsible for providing all municipal services such as law enforcement, animal control, road maintenance, library services, and recreation activities. Residents who live in Lennox are represented by the Second Supervisorial District of the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors maintains a field office at the Inglewood Courthouse, located at One Regent Street, Room 620.

Lennox Coordinating Council

The Lennox Coordinating Council is comprised of volunteers who live or work in Lennox. It is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to improve the quality of life of its residents and provide activities and events throughout the year about resources available to Lennox residents with a special focus on youth. The partners of the Lennox Coordinating Council include County departments, schools, businesses, community-based organizations and residents.

The Council meets the first Tuesday of every month at 6:00 pm in the community room at Lennox Park located at 10828 Condon Ave. Lennox, CA 90304.




In July 2009, the Los Angeles County Department of Regional Planning secured \$80,000 in grant funding for the Lennox community through a Compass Blueprint Demonstration Project award. Supported by the Southern California Association of Governments, Compass Blueprint Demonstration Projects seek to improve livability, mobility, prosperity, and sustain-ability in selected communities in Southern California.

Vision Lennox is a community outreach program to develop a Vision Plan for Lennox through a series of interactive workshops, walkabouts, and meetings. This program is designed to identify long and short term community development goals, with a focus on improving quality of life through targeted streetscape, connectivity, and environmental interventions.

Workshops began on March 15, 2010 and upcoming workshops are scheduled for April 19th and May 24th, 2010. All the workshops will be at Lennox Park from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.



Federal Stimulus Funding at Work –Bringing Jobs to Community Residents through Transitional Subsidized Employment



What is the Transitional Subsidized Employment Program?

The Transitional Subsidized Employment program is designed to help stimulate the economy in Los Angeles County and to help job seekers get hands-on experience in a real work setting where they can earn wages, develop new skills and enhance existing skills. They can then use those experiences to secure an unsubsidized job.

How can I get a subsidized job?

This program is open to CalWORKs and General Relief participants (with children on Medi-Cal or CalWORKs). If you think that you may qualify, just ask your Department of Public Social Services GAIN Services Worker or your GROW Case Manager. They can refer you to a WorkSource Center for screening and to match you with available subsidized job openings. Funding for this program will end on September 30, 2010.



New Lennox/Athens Sheriff Station Opening in 2010

Construction is nearing completion on the new 34,000 square-foot Lennox/Athens Station located at 1310 W. Imperial Highway. The facility will include a fueling station, heliport, and community room that will serve as a departmental operations center in case of emergencies. The station is scheduled to open in Spring 2010.



Turn Down the Volume!

We all like to enjoy good music from time to time, but did you know that you could receive a fine for playing your music too loudly?

According to Title 13, Chapter 13.45 of the County Code, it is unlawful for “any person to willfully make or continue, or cause to be made or continued, any loud, unnecessary, and unusual noise which disturbs the peace or quiet of any neighborhood or which causes discomfort or annoyance to any reasonable person of normal sensitiveness residing in the area...”

Not only does excessively loud music disturb your neighbors, it’s also against the law. Be a good neighbor. Be respectful. Turn down the volume!

Know Your Rights When You Are Approached for House Number Curb Painting

Recently, there have been problems reported in the Lennox area regarding solicitors. Before you say “yes” to any solicitor who wants to paint your house number and a logo on the curb in front of your house, be aware of the facts:

- **THE COUNTY DOES NOT EMPLOY ANYONE TO PAINT HOUSE NUMBERS ON CURBS!**
- The solicitor cannot charge you for any curb painting service. However, you can volunteer to give a monetary donation.
- Legally, you are not obligated to have your house number on the curb. However, the Fire Department recommends that your address is clearly marked on the front of your house. If your house is not visible from the street, you may post a sign next to your driveway.
- The person requesting to paint your curb must obtain and carry an Encroachment Permit from Public Works.
- The property owner’s permission must be obtained before painting the house number.
- Logos painted on the curb are not permitted in the unincorporated area.
- The solicitor must provide you with a copy of the curb painting guidelines and obtain your signature indicating you understand and have given permission to paint your curb.

If you would like to inquire if a company has a permit, please contact the Department of Public Works Permit Office at **(626) 458-3129**. If you feel threatened by any representative of a curb painting service, please notify your local law enforcement agency.



Crenshaw/LAX Transit Corridor Project

The proposed light rail project would provide an alternative mode of transportation to relieve congestion on the 405 Freeway and other north-south arteries in the western portion of Los Angeles County. It would also provide a critical connection to LAX and provides an efficient, clean mode of transportation.

Annual Food Basket Giveaway - Each year the LAX/Lennox Rotary Club, with support from the Lennox Coordinating Council (LCC) and the Lennox School District, distributes food baskets to needy families in Lennox. Each year, the LAX/Lennox Rotary Club and the LCC purchase staples from a local market in the community, assemble baskets, and distribute them door to door to needy families selected from the Lennox School District

In addition, the LAX/Lennox Rotary Club provides scholarships to graduating High School students who attended the Lennox School District as well as assist Lennox Library Children's Read - A- Loud and summer program.

The County Moves Forward to Re-Open Services at the New Martin Luther King Hospital

Since the closure of MLK-Harbor Hospital in August 2007, the County has been working on developing options to provide hospital services at the Martin Luther King (MLK) site. The proposal to reopen the new MLK Hospital will involve County and University of California officials who will work with the Governor's Office, the California Health and Human Services Agency, and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to secure the legislative, regulatory, and other programmatic support needed to execute, fund and implement this effort.

The process will include community input in the key implementation stages of the new MLK Hospital's development. Inpatient services could commence at the new hospital in late 2012. Stay tuned for future updates!

Be Counted! The Future is in Your Hands....Six Reasons to Fill Out Your 2010 Census Questionnaire



- 1. Helps Build Prosperity In Your Community** – Census data can help define strategies to make necessary public improvements in your community.
- 2. Helps in a Time of Need** – Many emergency services linked to 911 are structured based on maps developed with the data from the previous Census. Census information also helps health providers predict how disease is spread through communities between members of the population, and when natural disasters like earthquakes occur, the Census indicates to rescue teams how many people may need aid.
- 3. Puts Government to Work for You** - It's a great way to let your leaders know who you are and what you need. The numbers are used to help determine the distribution of more than \$400 billion in federal and State funds. The money will help finance educational and school lunch programs, medical centers, emergency services, transportation and other needs in your community.
- 4. Reduces Risk for Businesses** – Census numbers help reduce financial risks and allow the identification of potential markets so that business can produce the products that you want and need.
- 5. Helps You and Your Family** – The individual data stays confidential for 72 years, but you can request a certificate of past Censuses to use as verification of your age, residence, or kinship. This information can help you apply for a pension, establish citizenship or to obtain an inheritance.
- 6. It's Easy** – The 2010 Census will have one of the shortest Census questionnaires since the process began in the United States in 1790. The questionnaire now has only ten questions that will take approximately ten minutes to complete.

REMEMBER: all personal information collected by the Census is protected by law and strictly confidential!

Diabetes Educational Support Group - Lennox Senior Center

Join the free Diabetes Educational Support Group (DESG)! The DESG meets at 10:30 a.m. on the second Tuesday of each month at the Lennox Senior Center. The goal of the program is to keep seniors in their homes, reduce health care costs, and improve the quality of their lives. At the class, you will receive nutrition education and a one-on-one consultation provided by a bilingual (Spanish and English) Registered Dietitian. You will also be guided in an exercise class by a certified exercise specialist.

The diabetes educational support group is designed to help seniors who have never had adequate education regarding diabetes to understand and combat the disease.

To participate in the DESG, you must be enrolled in the Older Americans Act Senior Nutrition Program, which requires only that you be age 60 or older. Every senior in this age group is eligible to participate in the Older Americans Act Senior Nutrition programs.

The DESG program is provided by the Los Angeles County Area Agency on Aging/Community and Senior Services as a part of its nutrition programs throughout the county.

Help Change a Life-Become a Mentor!

The Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) is currently seeking mentors who would like to be positive role models and make a difference in a child's life! The goal of the new DCFS Mentoring Program is to ensure that youth residing in out of home care are afforded the opportunity to establish a strong, positive mentoring relationship with a caring and committed adult. Youth eligible for the program must be between the ages of 10 – 17 years old and have been in out of home placement for more than two years. Youth participants are matched with a mentor through community-based agencies and must be referred to the program by their LA County Children's Social Worker.

Interested mentors must be a minimum of 21 years of age, complete 15 hours of pre-match training, and commit to at least 12 months of participation by engaging in enrichment activities with the youth for a minimum of 8 hours per month.




HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION AND RAPID RE-HOUSING PROGRAM

If you are homeless or at risk of homelessness due to an unexpected financial hardship such as (but not limited to), job loss or a reduction in work hours. You may be eligible for the once-in-a-lifetime Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program (HPRP) and receive monetary assistance (paid directly to your landlord and/or utility company) for such expenses as:

- Security deposit
- Utility turn-on fee
- Back-due rent and/or utilities (gas/electric only)



What You Should Know about Conducting Yard/Garage Sales in Lennox

- You can only sell personal property
- You must be the resident of the dwelling where the sale takes place
- You cannot sell new items or items bought for resale
- You may place one on-site sign up to 4 square feet in area
- Up to 2 sales are allowed per dwelling unit in any 12-month period
- Each sale shall be limited to a maximum of 3 consecutive days
- You shall not conduct the sale between 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.





