Orange Grove Park is Now Open! 14517 Orange Grove Avenue, Hacienda Heights

Escape to serene surroundings against the backdrop of the Puente Hills with a view of the San Gabriel Mountains!

The completed \$4 million County project was developed through an agreement with the Hacienda La Puente Unified School District on surplus land located next to Orange Grove Elementary School. The park will be operated by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation. The community joined in a grand opening celebration held on May 28th.



The park includes dry creeks and rain gardens to capture rain water and replenish the water table, native California and drought tolerant plants, shade trees, bike racks and an exercise course with paths throughout the park for walking and running, playgrounds, picnic areas, a playing field and restrooms. As part of the County's civic art program, a small plaza was built that includes a large ground sundial. The park is located near trails that connect to nearby hiking areas.



Hacienda Heights Community and Recreation Center Construction Update 1234 Valencia Avenue



The new center and its surroundings are taking shape. The Board of Supervisors approved a construction contract between the Community Development Commission and KPRS Construction to build the new center on the seven acre site, formerly the site of Hillgrove Elementary School. The property will be leased from the Hacienda La Puente Unified School District to construct a gathering place for the community and will include a large multi-purpose space with a stage, a small multi-purpose room, arts and crafts room, computer room, and catering kitchen. The surrounding park will include walking trails, fitness stations, BBQ areas, picnic tables, and lawn areas for outdoor gatherings. As part of the County's Civic Art Program, "Circles of a Ripple" will offer visitors an opportunity to relax on benches that include a historical timeline of Hacienda Heights. The new Center is scheduled to be completed by the fall of 2014 and will be operated by the Los Angeles County Department of Parks and Recreation.





New Health Facility Planned for Hacienda Heights

In April, the Board of Supervisors voted to provide funding towards the development of a new health facility to be located in Hacienda Heights. Through a public/private partnership with the John Wesley Community Health Institute (JWCH), health services will be made available to underserved residents of Hacienda Heights and surrounding

areas. The Board has allocated \$400,000 to assist JWCH with renovations and startup expenses for offices in an existing medical building located at 2219 Hacienda Boulevard in Hacienda Heights.

JWCH is a private non-profit health agency that has a long history of partnership with the County to provide a variety of primary health care programs. The agency will provide access to primary health care, substance abuse treatment, HIV treatment and prevention, health education and mental health services. The goal of this partnership is to offer affordable, preventative health care which will assist in avoiding visits to the emergency room. The clinic is expected to open by the end of this year.

Asian Business Seminar

Approximately 200 participants attended the 2nd annual Asian Business Seminar co-hosted by the County of Los Angeles and the San Gabriel Valley Regional Chamber of Commerce in March. The objectives of the seminar were to strengthen communication with Asian owned businesses in the area, provide information on County regulations and up to date information on restaurant inspections required by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health.






Spring and Summer is Rattlesnake season. If you like to hike on local trails or live in areas where there is large amounts of brush nearby please be aware. If you see a rattlesnake on your property, call Animal Care and Control (ACC) and keep an eye on its whereabouts at a safe distance. If a rattlesnake bites someone, transport the victim to a hospital as quickly as possible or call 911. Call ACC for removal of the rattlesnake. 
The Truth: It’s likely a scam to get your money. Find out more information before you even consider sending money.

The One-Ring Scam: Your mobile phone rings once. You don’t recognize the incoming phone number and return the call.

The Truth: Do not return calls from an unfamiliar foreign phone number. If you call back, you may be connected to a chat service and stuck with a \$20 international calling fee, plus charges for each minute spent connected to the service.

Jury Duty Payment Scam: Someone calls demanding that you pay a fine for failing to appear for jury duty. They may even say that there is a warrant for your arrest. The callers falsely claim that they are from the Sheriff’s Department. The caller will instruct you to get a money order, conduct a wire transfer, or buy a gift card -- usually Green Dot -- and send it to ‘pay the fine.’

The Truth: Calls soliciting money are never made by the Sheriff’s Department or any government agency. Report suspicious phone calls to your local Sheriff’s, or to DCA.




Coping with Coyotes

Coyotes are often sighted in Hacienda Heights. There are several steps you can take to discourage coyote visits on your property.

- Never leave small children unattended in your yard.
- Keep small pets indoors. Keep pet food indoors or promptly remove dishes when pets complete their meal.
- Clear brush and dense weeds from around your property. This discourages small rodents from gathering near your home and deprives coyotes of a meal.
- Maintain trash cans with secure lids. Coyotes have been known to scavenge through the trash.
- Pick up fallen fruit and cover compost piles.
- Put away bird feeders at night to avoid attracting rodents and other coyote prey.
- Do not feed or leave water for coyotes or other wildlife. It is against the law to feed coyotes.

More Deputies Assigned to Industry Station During the Summer

The Summer Violent Crime Enforcement Team (SVCET) is funded by the Board of Supervisors to provide additional patrol to the Unincorporated areas during the summer.



The Industry Station SVCET consists of six deputies and a sergeant and focuses on gathering gang intelligence, conducting Parole and Probation compliance checks, collaborate with investigators to help solve local crime cases and address "quality of life" issues, such as street racing.

During last summer, this team made 113 felony arrests, 293 misdemeanor arrests and recovered eight firearms. Sixty-six traffic citations were issued, 15 vehicles were towed, one search warrant was served, and four houses were subjected to probation or parole searches.




Household Plan

Prepare a Household Emergency Kit that meets the needs of your family including any needs of children, the elderly, and pets. If you already have a kit, then make sure it's updated. Here is a checklist offered by the Department of Public Health (www.bereadyla.org) to get you started.

Emergency Kit

❑ Water

Store one gallon of water per person (or pet) per day in clean plastic containers (glass bottles may break).



❑ Food

Choose canned or packaged foods that don't require refrigeration or cooking such as ready-to-eat canned meats, beans, tuna fish, fruits and vegetables, canned juices, milk, soup, high energy foods, such as peanut butter, granola bars and trail mix. Remember to include foods that you and your family like, special food for infants or persons with dietary restrictions and pet food.

❑ First Aid Kit

Buy or put together a first aid kit for your home and one for each car containing:

- Sterile gauze and adhesive bandages in assorted sizes
- Hypoallergenic adhesive tape
- Tweezers, scissors, antibacterial cream
- Protective Gloves, cleansing agent/soap
- Sunscreen



❑ Medications

Prescription medications you and your family use daily (Have at least a 7 day supply of each one) and non-prescription medications you and your family use regularly.

❑ Tools and Supplies

- Solar, manual or battery operated radio and extra batteries
- Flashlights and extra batteries
- Manual can opener
- Fire extinguisher
- Whistle
- Work Gloves
- Tools to turn off gas and water
- Personal hygiene items, such as toilet paper, toothbrushes, toothpaste and soap
- Extra clothing and sturdy shoes



❑ Records

Store important records and documents in a waterproof, portable container. Examples include:

- Personal identification, financial, health and insurance information and other important documents
- Inventory of valuable household items
- Family records
- Cash in small bills

Trash Container Placement Regulations



Trash containers should be placed out of sight after your regular collection date. The County of Los Angeles Code of Ordinances indicates that you should not place any solid waste, or any container containing solid waste, at any place of collection before 5:00 p.m. of the day before the scheduled collection date, or leave a container at the place of collection after 8:00 p.m. on the day of actual collection, or more than two hours after actual collection, whichever is later.
