JUNE 22 BOARD OF SUPERVISORS---AGENDA HIGHLIGHTS

9:30 a.m.

(Budget deliberations rescheduled for 1:30 p.m. Monday, June 21, due to funeral for Sheriff's Deputy Michael R. Arruda. The Board will meet in closed session Wednesday, June 23 at 9:30 a.m. to consider candidates for county counsel.)

Public Hearings:

Supervisors asked to approve \$8 event parking rate for non-peak daytime hours, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Walt Disney Concert Hall. (Item 5)

Proposal would establish \$35 fee for appointments of individuals to perform civil marriages. (Item 7)

Approval sought to create a letter-grade system for animal facilities, based on annual inspections, in unincorporated areas. (Item 8)

Board considers establishing community standards district for Florence-Firestone area to mitigate land use conflicts. (Item 11)

Proposal would remove unwarranted zoning burdens to allow development of more child care facilities to counter an acute shortage of providers. (Item 12)

Agenda Items:

Financial status of Department of Health Services reported to Board. (S-1, 11:30 a.m.)

Supervisor Don Knabe asks supervisors to support effort to have local governments consulted before any changes are made to recent agreement reached between Governor Schwarzenegger and local governments in which \$2.6 billion is given over next two years to help reduce state budget deficit. (Item 15, continued from 6-15)

Beaches and Harbors Department asks supervisors to approve one-time modification of condominium lessees for Parcel 125R, Marina City Club, in Marina del Rey to allow a temporary freeze on annual rent increases and the rate of future increases to be fixed. (Item 22)

Board asked to increase budget to \$1,295,000 for project to replace outdated Marina del Rey tidegate regulating water flow through the Ballona Lagoon and Venice Canals

to prevent flooding and enhance tidal exchange. (Item 23)

Consideration given to reassignment of lease for Parcel 10R, Marina del Rey (Neptune Marina Apartments), to Legacy Partners Neptune Marina, which will result in increased revenue to the County from higher boat slip and live-aboard percentage rates retroactive to 1993. (Item 24)

Board considers rescinding its denial of permit to Transit Mixed Concrete Co. for sand and gravel mining project in Soledad Canyon, as part of court-approved consent decree to settle the federal lawsuit. (Item 27, continued from 6-15)

New 30-year operating lease considered with Los Angeles Philharmonic Association for operation of Hollywood Bowl and payment of \$250,000 in bonus rent to County by August 1. (Item 29)

Emergency Medical Services Commission asks supervisors to support ballot initiative that would use surcharge on telephone calls made within California to fund emergency rooms, trauma centers and the 9-1-1 emergency dispatch system. (Item 31, continued from 5-18 and 6-15)

Urgency ordinance considered to establish smoking ban on public beaches, exclusive of public parking areas, in unincorporated areas of County. (Item 32)
