King/Drew Medical Center

-- Report to be given on status of reform at King/Drew Medical Center. (Item S-1, 2:30 p.m.)

-- \$250,000 consulting contract proposed to assist King/Drew Advisory Board in the completion of its review. (Item 14, cont. from 5/24) **MOLINA SUBSTITUTE MOTION APPROVED TO DIRECT DHS TO PROVIDE THE ADVISORY BOARD WITH SERVICES OF INDEPENDENT MEDICAL REVIEWERS AND COUNTY COUNSEL TO PROVIDE LEGAL ADVICE, BOTH WITHIN THEIR PRESENT BUDGET**

Sheriff Lee Baca to discuss budget needs. (2 p.m.)

Supervisor Yvonne B. Burke recommends appointment of the Rev. Cecil Leonard Murray to the Commission for Children and Families. (Item 1) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Zev Yaroslavsky asks that June be proclaimed "Transgender Pride Month." (Item 2) **APPROVED**

Proposal would forge friendship agreement with Province of Rome to encourage trade and tourism. (Item 7) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Don Knabe motion would develop regulations for medical marijuana dispensaries in unincorporated areas. (Item 8) **INTERIM URGENCY ORDINANCE ADOPTED TO TEMPORARILY PROHIBIT ESTABLISHMENT OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES WHILE A STUDY IS CONDUCTED TO DETERMINE THE APPROPRIATE ZONES AND DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS. JULY 12 WILL BE HEARING TO CONSIDER EXTENSION OF THE URGENCY ORDINANCE.**

Recommendation would reinstate the \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of person(s) responsible for the shooting and injuring of Los Angeles County Sheriff's Deputy Michael Schaap on Sept. 5, 2000 during a traffic stop in Whittier. (Item 9) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich requests Health Services work with private hospitals to develop plan to make public the rate of infections at hospitals and implementation of surprise random inspections to ensure compliance. (Item 12) **APPROVED**

Board asked to approve \$112,000 to assist in planning improvements at Natural History Museum. (Item 22) **APPROVED**

Ordinance would update the provisions governing the operations of the Los Angeles County Commission on HIV Health Services, including name change and amended conflict of interest provisions. (Item 28 and 98) **YAROSLAVSKY CONTINUED 1 WEEK**

Supervisors asked to approve relocation of winery in Agua Dulce allowing it to increase production and provide tours and wine-tasting facilities. (Item 32, cont. from 4/5) **APPROVED**

Proposal would allow a licensed pharmacist to sell or furnish up to 10 syringes to a person without a prescription, if the pharmacy is registered in the Disease Prevention Demonstration Project. (Item 38, cont. from 4/19, 5/10 and 5/17) **DEPARTMENT CONTINUED 2 WEEKS**

\$50,000 donation would assist Health Services offset costs of participating in program that will study human health risks posed by the fish contamination related to the Palos Verdes Shelf Superfund Site. (Item 54) **APPROVED**

Supervisors asked to approve plans for estimated \$826,500 improvement project at Carolyn Rosas County Park in Rowland Heights and \$606,972 for Los Robles Park in Hacienda Heights. (Item 60 and 61) **APPROVED**

Recommendation would allow sheriff to apply for \$189,000 state grant to implement off-highway vehicle enforcement program at Santa Clarita Valley and Palmdale stations to protect natural resources. (Item 86) **APPROVED**

Proposal would increase County's annual contribution to employees retirement by \$74 million. (Item 89) **APPROVED**

Report requested in 60 days on what the Department of Public Social Services is doing to prevent fraud in the CalWORKS child care program. (Item 101-B) **APPROVED**

Extension of \$10,000 reward proposed for information leading to the arrest and conviction of person(s) responsible for the death of Sharon Anne Santos last September. She was found in truck of her car in Chinatown after leaving Warner Brothers Studios. (Item 101-C) **APPROVED**

Extension of \$5,000 reward offered for information leading to arrest and conviction of person(s) responsible for vandalism of 100 vehicles, five businesses and New Vista Middle School since March 10. (Item 101-D) **APPROVED**
