Members of John Muir High School's "Destination Imagination" team honored for placing second in the state finals and sending seven students to the Global Finals in Tennessee.

Report given on why Children and Family Services decided to no longer comply with out-of-home care evaluation unit reports required by Los Angeles Juvenile Court (Item S-1, 11 a.m.)

Status report scheduled on reform at King/Drew Medical Center. (Item S-2, 11:30 a.m.)

\$103 million budget for Community Development Commission/Housing Authority proposed. (Item 1-D) **APPROVED**

\$645,200 proposal would finance the building of educational/recreational center for low-income public housing residents living near Normandie and 105<sup>th</sup> St. (Item 2-D) **APPROVED**

Recommendation would designate fire stations in city of Pasadena as "Safe Surrender" sites for unwanted newborns. (Item 2) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Don Knabe motion would request quarterly reports from the sheriff showing that all gang injunction violators have been serving 100% of their court-imposed sentence. (Item 3) **APPROVED**

Board asked to refer back to Regional Planning Commission a proposal for 43-home development in Rowland Heights on land currently designated as "open space." (Item 4) **DEFEATED 2-3, WITH ANTONOVICH, MOLINA AND YARSLAVSKY OPPOSING. PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE BOARD TO BE SCHEDULED**

Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich asks Board request state appropriate necessary funding to adequately monitor and supervise sex offenders. (Item 5) **APPROVED**

Supervisors Zev Yaroslavsky and Yvonne B. Burke propose research study exploring best ways to help welfare recipients and their families transition from welfare to work and achieve success. (Item 12) **APPROVED**

Ordinance would update the provisions governing the operations of the Los Angeles County

Commission on HIV Health Services, including name change and amended conflict of interest provisions. (Item 25 and 61, cont. from 5/31) **APPROVED**

Board support requested for state legislation to deter the crime of human trafficking. (Item 26) **APPROVED**

Increase from \$25.22 to \$25.72 per parcel recommended for library special tax. (Item 39) **APPROVED 4-1, WITH YAROSLAVSKY OPPOSING**

\$1-1.2 million proposal would replace bridge on Lake Vista Drive over Malibou Lake. (Item 50) **APPROVED**

Board asked to issue \$14 million in tax-exempt notes to make capital improvements at the Museum of Natural History. (Item 64) **DEPARTMENT CONTINUED 1 WEEK**
