Final Actions -- Nov. 22 Meeting

(Unless otherwise indicated, vote was unanimous.)

Issuance of up to \$40 million in lease revenue bonds proposed to finance improvement projects at the Calabasas Landfill. (Item 1-F, 18) **APPROVED**

\$1.6 million proposal would allow for the continuation of anti-gang and crime prevention programs in the unincorporated areas of the County. (Item 1) **APPROVED**

Imposition of \$54 fee recommended for the release of a properly seized, stored or impounded firearms to help recoup administrative costs. (Item 4) **APPROVED**

Proposal would adopt 2005 Urban Water Management Plan for Malibu, Marina del Rey, and Antelope Valley water systems, including a water shortage contingency plan, water conservation practices and projection of future water needs. (Item 5) **APPROVED**

Proposal would extend \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of person(s) responsible for the murder of Jose Isabel Murillo, who was found dead at his home on the 1100 block of West 89th Street in June 2005. (Item 7) **APPROVED**

\$240,000 annual salary recommended for new Health Services Department chief healthcare network officer/chief deputy director, along with termination benefits equal to six months salary. (Item 12, cont. from 11/15) **APPROVED**

In response to LA Times investigative series on conservator mismanagement/abuse of the elderly, report scheduled on creation of task force and legislation to prevent the problem. (Item 19) **WRITTEN REPORT PROVIDED.** Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich requests report on fiscal needs through 2010 of the Public Guardian probate conservatorship program and recommendations to improve oversight and monitoring of private guardians. (20-C) **APPROVED**

Supervisors Gloria Molina and Zev Yaroslavsky ask that \$20 million be spent on homeless shelters and enhancements to homeless support services. (Item 20-A) **APPROVED**

Recommendation calls for Sheriff Lee Baca to provide full report to Board and corrective action plan regarding the beating death of inmate at Men's Central Jail on Nov. 16. (Item 20-D) **APPROVED**
