Final Actions -- Nov. 29 Meeting

(Unless otherwise indicated, vote was 4-0. Supervisor Molina absent.)

Board reviews in closed session class action lawsuit which contends that the County and the Superior Court have failed to provide physical access to courthouses for disabled persons. (CS-1) **SETTLEMENT AUTHORIZED**

Members of Los Altos High School honored for winning the “Build Your Dream Vehicle Competition” and placing third in the “Botball National Tournament.”

Zack Ewald honored for receiving the Boy Scouts of America Medal of Merit after saving a child from drowning at Yellowstone National Park.

Acceptance of \$107,510 grant would help prepare site in Willowbrook for future development of childcare facility. (Item 1-D, 20) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Don Knabe requests letter be sent to President Bush and Los Angeles County congressional delegation urging that Air Force buy more C-17 Globemaster 111 transport jets after contract with Boeing in Long Beach runs out in 2008. (Item 3) **APPROVED**

Proposal would reestablish \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of person(s) responsible for the shooting of Sheriff’s Deputy Michael Schaap during traffic stop in Whittier in 2000. (Item 4) **APPROVED**

Proposal would extend \$10,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of person(s) responsible for the murders of Richard and William Betts in Hacienda Heights in 2004. (Item 5) **APPROVED**

Recommendation would approve sale of 46.5 acres in Chatsworth to Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority for \$100,000 for open space, public recreation and park use. (Item 11) **APPROVED**

Board asked to ratify three-year contract for county police officers for period of Oct. 1, 2003 through Sept. 30, 2006, which provides salary increases of 5 percent, and 2.5 percent increase for coroner investigators Jan. 1, 2006. (Item 13, 14) **APPROVED**

Proposal would terminate leases in Marina del Rey at cost of \$6.1 million in effort to expand Chace Park and provide more boating and visitor development. (Item 15) **KNABE CONTINUED 2 WEEKS**

Proposal would allow an Air Force medical officer displaced by Hurricane Katrina to complete

his residency training at County+USC Medical Center. (Item 25) **APPROVED**

\$3.4 million proposal would increase the hourly rate of anesthesia services at County medical facilities, ranging from \$40 to \$100 more per hour, depending on service provided. (Item 28) **APPROVED**

\$5.7 million contract increase would fund additional hardware/software for three County hospital computer systems and services, bringing total contract to \$62 million. (Item 29) **BURKE CONTINUED 1 WEEK**

Proposal would allow purchase of \$411,000 nuclear medicine gamma camera system to replace 20-year-old equipment at Olive View - UCLA Medical Center. (Item 38) **APPROVED**

\$495,319 proposal would develop evaluation tool for replacing, upgrading and consolidating the fire/sheriff public safety communications system. (Item 39) **APPROVED WITH AMENDMENT BY ANTONOVICH TO DEVELOP A TASK FORCE ON FINANCING OF SYSTEM, ESTIMATED TO COST \$500 MILLION**

\$6 million contract for welfare-to-work case management services, along with options for two one-year extensions, proposed for private company. (Item 43, cont. from 11/15) **APPROVED**

\$450,000 settlement proposed for two siblings who were abused and neglected in the home of their aunt while under supervision of Department of Children and Family Services. (Item 72) **SETTLEMENT APPROVED; CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN CONTINUED 2 WEEKS BY YAROSLAVSKY**

\$750,000 settlement proposed for dangerous condition lawsuit brought by man who suffered serious injuries as the result of a car accident. (Item 73) **APPROVED**

\$817,000 settlement proposed to buy Hacienda Heights home damaged by landslide. (Item 74) **APPROVED**

Increase in fees asked for inspections of commercial weights and measures equipment. (Item 84) **APPROVED**
