### **Dec. 6 Meeting**

**(Meeting begins at 9:30 a.m.)**

Board reviews in closed session lawsuit challenging alleged curtailments at King/Drew Medical Center and other county health facilities. (CS-1)

Board reviews in closed session lawsuits for alleged wrongful death of jail inmates. (CS-2 and CS-3)

Board reorganizes leadership roles, with Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich becoming mayor and nominations taken for mayor pro tem. (S-1, 9:30 a.m.)

Pasadena Rose Parade queen and her court honored.

Report scheduled by Sheriff's Department on beating death of inmate at Men's Central Jail on Nov. 16 and corrective action plan to prevent deaths in the future. (S-2, 11:30 a.m.)

\$2.5 million proposal would fund various projects to enhance recreational opportunities and improve environment along the Los Angeles River. (Item 1-P)

\$700,000 recommendation would assist Malibu purchase 20 acres of land for its Legacy Park Project, which will include habitat restoration and pathways. (Item 2-P)

Proposal would accept donation of 2,579 sq. ft. of land/property from San Dimas residents for use as a connecting segment to the Michael D. Antonovich Trail. (Item 7)

Recommendation would allow proceeds from the sale of up to \$40 million in lease revenue bonds to be used to finance improvement projects at the Calabasas and Mission Canyon landfill sites. (Item 9)

\$474,911 recommendation would create a Children and Families Research Consortium run by UCLA to develop program to track and improve outcomes for child welfare cases. (Item 16)

Acceptance of \$5 million from lawsuit settlement funds would be used to enhance consumer education/protection programs against fraud. (Item 18)

Recommendation would approve construction of three-story hotel and parking lot in Castaic. (Item 19, cont. from 9/27, when Board indicated intent to approve with amendments)

Larry King Cardiac Foundation offers cardiac devices, worth about \$750,000 annually, for indigent patients at County+USC Healthcare Network for three years. (Item 24)

\$5.7 million contract increase would fund additional hardware/software for three County hospital computer systems and services, bringing total contract to \$62 million. (Item 26, cont. from 11/29)

Proposal would begin the process for the planning, development, construction and operation of a San Gabriel River Discovery Center within the Whittier Narrows Recreational area. (Item 30)

\$840,000 recommendation would begin immediate installation of temporary bridge on Beverly Boulevard in Montebello that was destroyed by fire on Nov. 1, without advertising for bids. (Item 40)

In compliance with discrimination lawsuit, Sheriff's Department proposes to spend \$513,000 to redesign employment physical performance/agility tests and evaluation. (Item 47)

Report to be given on plan to screen campaign finance filings to ensure compliance with Prop. B, and plans to establish a unit to monitor compliance (Item 56, cont. from 10/11, 10/25, 11/1 and 11/15)

Hearing scheduled on proposal to transfer Gorman area to Kern County. (Item 60)
