Final Actions -- June 20 Meeting

(Unless otherwise indicated, vote was 4-0. Knabe was absent.)

Board reviews in closed session lawsuit concerning allegations that Department of Public Social Services employee was subjected to racial harassment and discrimination. (CS-1, cont. from 6/7, 6/13) **CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN APPROVED**

Board reviews in closed session lawsuit by a Sheriff's Department employee alleging disability discrimination, retaliation and sexual harassment. (CS-2) **NO REPORTABLE ACTION**

County Police Officer Thomas Candelaria honored for his life-saving assistance during two serious incidents.

North Hollywood High School science team honored for winning the Los Angeles City Department of Water and Power Science Bowl Regional Competition and placing second in the U.S. Department of Energy National Science Bowl.

\$1 million proposal would fund the balance of estimated \$2.45 million purchase of 80 acres of open space land in Claremont area as part of the Marshall Canyon Conservation Corridor, and set Aug. 22 for hearing. (Item 1-P, 13, and 58) **APPROVED**

Board asked to adopt 2006-07 budget for the Regional Park and Open Space District, and reallocate \$55.8 million in excess funds for capital projects. (Item 2-P) **APPROVED**

Extension of \$10,000 reward recommended for information leading to arrest/conviction of individual(s) responsible for the murder of Samuel Williams III in Los Angeles on July 16, 2004. (Item 6) **APPROVED**

\$48,000 proposal would fund contract with Cable Channel 36 to film, edit and cablecast 12 performances from the John Anson Ford Amphitheatre's 2006 summer season. (Item 8) **APPROVED**

\$108,000 proposal would reimburse 211 LA County for the purchase of computer system which will enable staff to respond from remote locations to requests for help from residents in emergency situations, as well as help forecast budget/personnel needs. (Item 12) **APPROVED**

\$214,000 proposal would fund the development/expansion of County websites that will provide residents of unincorporated areas access to information on municipal services within their community as well as regional services offered Countywide.(Item 19) **CIO CONT. TO JULY 5**

Board asked to approve one-year \$12 million contract extension with Drew University for clinical/academic services at King/Drew Medical Center and Hubert H. Humphrey Health Center, and \$2.3 million in retroactive payments for related expenses. (Item 38) **APPROVED**

Agreement would provide \$753,430 to prepare for pandemic influenza. (Item 25) **APPROVED**

Responding to influx of homeless adults with mental illness in need of temporary emergency shelter, recommendation would expand number of beds countywide for these persons and their families. (Item 48) **APPROVED**

Proposal would allow operator of Catalina Island Visitor Interpretive Center the right to relocate the County facility to new location that would be of equal if not greater visibility and meet the needs of residents and visitors. (Item 56) **ANTONOVICH CONT. 1 WEEK**

\$280,000 proposal would fund the expansion of the senior center at William S. Hart Park in Santa Clarita. (Item 57) **APPROVED**

Board asked to increase tax levy for libraries to \$26.23 from \$25.72. (Item 59, cont. from 5/30, 6/13) **LIBRARY CONT. 1 WEEK**

\$238,000 proposal would fund project to retrofit Anaheim Street over the Long Beach Freeway Bridge in Long Beach. (Item 68) **APPROVED**

\$15,000 proposal would fund pilot public transit shuttle service program in Marina del Rey area for 2006 summer season from July 1 through Sept. 4. (Item 72) **APPROVED**

\$126,000 proposal would provide City of Long Beach with the services of a sheriff's criminalist to perform DNA testing and analysis. (Item 94) **APPROVED**

Sheriff requests authority to seek \$500,000 grant for program to reduce gang violence in Antelope Valley. (Item 96) **APPROVED**

\$4.2 million proposal would fund document imaging services for Public Defender and Alternate Public Defender's offices, bringing total contract for all departments utilizing services to \$18.7 million. (Item 100) **APPROVED**

\$210,000 settlement plus assumption of Medi-Cal lien not to exceed \$8,874 proposed for wrongful death/medical negligence lawsuit brought by family of boy who died while being treated at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. (Item 101) **COUNTY COUNSEL CONT. 1 WEEK**

\$110,000 settlement proposed for wrongful death lawsuit brought by family of man who died while in sheriff's custody. (Item 102) **APPROVED**
