Final Actions: June 27 Meeting

(Unless otherwise indicated, vote was unanimous.)

Board reviews in closed session class action lawsuit concerning past gender discrimination practice and the procedure for investigating harassment complaints within the Sheriff's Department. (CS-1) **NO REPORTABLE ACTION**

Board reviews in closed session continuing class action lawsuit regarding conditions of confinement in the County jails. (CS-2) **ANTONOVICH CONT. TO JULY 5**

College of Canyons Men's Golf Team honored for winning the 2006 California State Community College Golf Championship.

Four County lifeguards honored for saving a life in Redondo Beach.

Proposal would increase garbage collection fees for single family residences in the Mesa Heights Garbage Disposal District from \$112 to \$225. (Item 1) **APPROVED**

Fire Department proposes new fees to review and process film production permits. (Item 11) **APPROVED**

Board considers permit for continued operation of Agua Dulce Airport. (Item 12) **REGIONAL PLANNING VOTE UPHELD, WITH AMENDMENTS, 4-1, ANTONOVICH OPPOSING**

Supervisor Yvonne B. Burke proposes urgency ordinance imposing restrictions on the drilling of new oil wells and the deepening of existing oil wells in Baldwin Hills, and set Aug. 8 for hearing to consider extension of ordinance. (Item 15) **APPROVED**

Development of protocol suggested for TB screening, hepatitis vaccinations, traumatic stress-relieving debriefing sessions and hand sanitizers for employees working with homeless in Skid Row. (Item 16) **APPROVED**

Extension of \$10,000 reward recommended for information leading to arrest/conviction of individual(s) responsible for the murder of Cedric Smalls on Sept. 16, 2005. (Item 17) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Zev Yaroslavsky requests investigation into whether county custodial contractor misappropriated county cost of living adjustment (COLA) funds for its employees, seek reimbursement if charges are confirmed, and evaluate corrective action plan. (Item 19) **APPROVED**

Board asked to approve lease modification with City of Santa Monica to reduce the number of Superior Court parking spaces for employees and jurors from 450 to 325, and increase County's rent for parking from \$324,000 to \$583,600. (Item 23) **APPROVED**

Acceptance of \$5.89 million grant would help fund emergency room/inpatient services at LAC+USC Medical Center for indigent patients residing in QueensCare service area.(Item 27) **APPROVED**

Proposal would allow operator of Catalina Island Visitor Interpretive Center the right to relocate the County facility to new location that would be of equal if not greater visibility and meet the needs of residents and visitors. (Item 30, cont. from 6/20) **APPROVED**

Board asked to increase tax levy for libraries to \$26.23 from \$25.72. (Item 31, cont. from 5/30, 6/13, 6/20) **FAILED. BOARD VOTED 5-0 TO KEEP AT PRESENT LEVEL.**

\$12 million proposal would award contract for improvements at the Cerritos Regional Park, which includes building new parking lots, renovating turf, and relocating trees. (Item 35) **APPROVED**

Sheriff asks to reallocate \$15.7 million in his services and supplies budget to fund capital projects, including renovating the Compton and Lennox Sheriff's Stations, and repaying loan for the Lakewood Station expansion. (Item 37) **APPROVED, WITH AMENDMENT BY MOLINA FOR SHERIFF TO USE \$1.5 MILLION IN DEPARTMENT SAVINGS FOR GANG SUPPRESSION UNITS IN UNINCORPORATED AREAS**

\$210,000 settlement plus assumption of Medi-Cal lien not to exceed \$8,874 proposed for wrongful death/medical negligence lawsuit brought by family of boy who died while being treated at Harbor-UCLA Medical Center. (Item 40, cont. from 6/13) **APPROVED**
