### Final Results -- Dec. 12 Meeting

(Unless otherwise noted, vote was 4-0. Yaroslavsky was absent.)

Board to review in closed session lawsuit seeking damages for injuries sustained by an inmate at the Men's Central Jail. (Item CS-1) **CONT. TO 12/19**

Board to review in closed session lawsuit alleging the County caused the state to submit false claims to the federal Medicaid program through the way inter-governmental transfers were used. (Item CS-2) **AUTHORIZED COUNTY COUNSEL TO PURSUE A FINAL RESOLUTION OF THE PLAINTIFF'S OBLIGATION TO PAY COSTS IN THIS LITIGATION.**

Board to review in closed session lawsuit seeking damages against the County for allegedly failing to advise a father of his daughter's whereabouts. (Item CS-3) **NO REPORTABLE ACTION**

Broad Oaks Children's School of Whittier College honored on 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Report to be given on Health Services Department's strategic plan, anticipated costs, and the impact the changes will have on County residents. (Item S-1, 11:30 a.m.)

\$126,000 proposal would fund consulting services to address negative findings by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development regarding the County's Section 8 housing voucher program. (Item 1-H) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Don Knabe requests approval of \$600,000 to assist in funding a three-year \$2.3 million pilot program to implement rating system to provide parents with information on the quality of child care centers/homes. (Item 2) **APPROVED**

Supervisors Michael D. Antonovich and Yvonne B. Burke ask protocols be established for the Office of Independent Review's oversight of Department of Children and Family Services administrative investigations into cases involving child injuries and deaths. (Item 5) **ANTONOVICH TOOK OFF CALENDAR**

\$10,000 reward proposed for information leading to arrest/conviction of individual(s) responsible for the smashing of 20 windows in Lancaster on Dec. 1. (Item 6) **APPROVED**

Proposal would extend \$10,000 rewards for information leading to arrest/conviction of individuals responsible for the 2006 murders of John Edward Politelli in Stevenson Ranch and Esfandiar (a.k.a. Steven) Kadivar in Lancaster, and the burglary/vandalism of office building at Apollo Park in Antelope Valley on Oct. 3. (Items 7, 8, 10) **APPROVED**

Proposal would extend \$10,000 reward for information leading to arrest/conviction of Maria Cedano Ayala, accused of kidnapping 4-month-old Joliette Serrano in Palmdale. (Item 9) **APPROVED**

Three-year \$16 million contract proposed for 2-1-1 information and referral service. (Item 13, cont. from 12/5) **APPROVED**

Proposal would allow implementation of \$19.3 million in homeless programs approved by Board in September. (Item 16) **APPROVED 4-0 EXCEPT FOR TWO PROGRAMS, FOR WHICH VOTE WAS 3-1, WITH ANTONOVICH OPPOSING**

Proposal would extend lease terms for developer in Marina del Rey by 41 years, allow demolition of 201 apartments and construction of 544 new apartments. (Item 18) **APPROVED**

\$5.3 million plan would repair portion of the Marina del Rey seawall most damaged by tidal changes. (Item 19) **APPROVED**

\$450,000 proposal would fund database on services provided to indigent adults in effort to better serve these individuals. (Item 20, cont. from 12/5) **APPROVED**

Board asked to approve environmental impact report for the proposed \$7.46 million Sorensen Library in unincorporated area near Whittier. (Item 23) **APPROVED**

\$56 million increase proposed for computer systems in hospitals. (Items 30, 31) **APPROVED**

\$135 million proposal would extend the Department of Public Social Services computer systems contract for five years in order to provide uninterrupted service to the public until a replacement for LEADER system is found. (Item 34) **CONTRACT EXTENDED TO JAN. 30, 2007**

Exclusive trash franchise recommended for Rowland Heights. (Item 40) **APPROVED**

Board asked to adopt plans for Interstate 5/Hasley Canyon Road interchange in Castaic at estimated \$29.5-\$34.5 million cost. (Item 51) **APPROVED**

\$1.5 million grant would assist mentally ill adults in jail and after release, including helping them find transportation, employment, housing and mental health services. (Item 54) **APPROVED**

Plan requested for development of comprehensive program to combat food stamp trafficking. (Item 61-A) **APPROVED**

\$10,000 reward proposed for information leading to arrest/conviction of Saul Jaime Vaca Arceo (aka Jaime Arceo Vaca), who is suspected of assaulting his estranged wife in North San Gabriel and endangering his children by setting afire a vehicle in which they were sleeping in Altadena. (Item 61-C) **APPROVED**
