### Final Actions: June 5 Meeting

(Unless otherwise noted, vote was 4-0. Molina arrived late.)

Board meets in closed session to discuss May 9 death at King-Harbor Hospital. (CS-1) **NO REPORTABLE ACTION**

Tracy High School in Cerritos honored for being named “2007 California Model Continuation High School.”

Artesia High School boys basketball team honored in recognition of winning second consecutive Division III CIF State Championship.

Sheriff to report on the recruitment/promotion/retention of female deputies. (Item S-1, 11 a.m.)

Board asked to approve Community Development Commission’s \$430 million budget for FY 2007-08, of which \$286 million is for Housing Authority. (Item 1-D, 1-H) **APPROVED**

Supervisors Yvonne B. Burke and Zev Yaroslavsky proposal would urge the U.S. Postal Service to issue commemorative postal stamp in honor of the late Los Angeles Mayor Tom Bradley. (Item 3) **APPROVED**

Proposal would develop tobacco retail licensing ordinance for the unincorporated areas of the County in effort to curtail youth access to tobacco products. (Item 6) **APPROVED 5-0 WITH AMENDMENT BY BURKE TO INVESTIGATE IF FEES COULD BE ADJUSTED FOR SMALL BUSINESSES WITH LOW SALES OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS**

Supervisor Don Knabe requests support of SB 575, which would provide for the sale of the Fred C. Nelles Correctional Facility in Whittier; Probation Department reports on governor’s juvenile justice initiative. (Items 8, 74, cont. from 5/22, 5/29) **REFERRED BACK BY KNABE**

Board support requested for SB 670 to stop the current reconveyance fee procedure that allows fees to continue in perpetuity. (Item 12, cont. from 5/1, 5/8) **REFERRED BACK BY ANTONOVICH**

Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich recommends that Board deputies be included in all “cluster” meetings of departments held by the new Chief Executive Office and that all such meetings be subject to Brown Act. (Items 13, cont. from 5/29; 75D) **KNABE CONT. TO 6-19**

Proposal would request federal government to provide stronger enforcement in importation of

puppies to reduce abuse/neglect associated with dog breeding operations known as “puppy mills.” (Item 14) **APPROVED**

\$247,588 proposal would purchase land adjacent to Chester Washington Golf Course in unincorporated area near Los Angeles, which is now leased to provide customer parking/emergency vehicle access. (Item 16) **APPROVED**

Proposal would waive parking/entry fees for vehicles with valid veterans special license plates entering County-owned/operated public lots, regional parks and County-enforced parking metered spots. (Item 20) **APPROVED**

District Attorney’s Office seeks authorization to apply and accept \$135,000 in grant funds for investigation/prosecution of felony gang crimes. (Item 27) **APPROVED 5-0**

\$5.3 million grant would enable County’s Emergency Medical Services Agency to better prevent, respond to and recover from threats or acts of terrorism. (Item 29) **APPROVED**

Librarian asks for 4 percent increase in special tax rate for 44 public libraries to keep from imposing cuts in services and books. (Item 43) **REFERRED BACK BY LIBRARY**

Board asked to approve: \$2.3 million for two new prefabricated buildings and refurbishing of existing structure and parking lot at Allen J. Martin Park near La Puente; \$3.4 million for two new soccer fields, play area and lighting/landscape/irrigation enhancement at Bassett County Park; and \$515,000 for Legg Lake Fishing Pier project at Whittier Narrows Recreation Area in South El Monte area. (Items 44, 45, 46, cont. from 5/29) **APPROVED**

Supervisors asked to approve environmental impact report for proposed new \$4.2 million fire station in Saugus, and set July 10 for bid opening. (Item 47) **APPROVED**

Recommendation calls for approving plans for estimated \$22.1 million sheriff’s station in Athens, hiring architect/engineer construction administrative services consultant for up to \$700,000, and setting July 3 for bid opening. (Item 48) **APPROVED**
