### Final Results: June 19 Meeting

(Unless otherwise noted, vote was 5-0.)

Board meets in closed session to discuss County's legal challenge of two Los Angeles City redevelopment projects: City Center and Central Industrial. (CS-1, cont. from 6/12) **NO REPORTABLE ACTION**

Various organizations honored for their efforts in protecting residents/structures during the Catalina Island fire.

Mirai Nagasu honored as 2006 Junior Ladies National Ice Skating Champion.

82-year-old Lillian Olivas honored for earning high school diploma from Bassett Adult School. (Cont. from 6/12)

Board asked to approve schematic design drawings for phase I of the Grand Avenue Project in downtown Los Angeles. (Item S-1, 11 a.m., cont. from 6/12) **APPROVED 4-1, WITH ANTONOVICH OPPOSED**

Sheriff reports on the early release of Paris Hilton, including the reasons for not placing her in an appropriate jail ward medical facility. (Item S-2, noon) **CONT. TO 6/26**

\$400,000 proposal would fund kitchen renovation of structure in Long Beach to feed homeless veterans. (Item 2-D) **APPROVED**

Supervisors asked to authorize \$3.7 million child care center in East Los Angeles. (Item 3-D) **APPROVED**

\$750,000 proposal would provide transitional shelter/services for homeless women with children in Littlerock and set aside funding for St. Joseph Manor, Inc. to acquire property. (Item 4-D) **APPROVED**

\$250,000 proposal would fund construction of new 8,000-square-foot park between La Crescenta and La Canada/Flintridge. (Item 1-P) **APPROVED**

Board asked to approve 2007 plan of revenues/expenditures for Regional Park/Open Space District, including \$37.8 million of excess funds available for allocation in 2007-08. (Item 2-P) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Zev Yaroslavsky urges support of AB 1470, which would establish a new gas utility

surcharge to fund program to subsidize the installation of solar hot water heaters. (Item 2)  
**APPROVED 3-2, WITH ANTONOVICH AND KNABE OPPOSED**

Supervisor Don Knabe requests plan to reform education programs in County's juvenile halls/probation camps, including feasibility of charter schools/other innovative models of education. (Item 6) **APPROVED WITH AMENDMENT BY ANTONOVICH TO INCLUDE EXPANSION AND ENHANCEMENT OF VOCATIONAL SCHOOLS AND PARTNERSHIPS WITH COLLEGES**

Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich recommends that Board deputies be included in all "cluster" meetings of departments held by the new Chief Executive Office and that all such meetings be subject to Brown Act. (Items 10, 11, cont. from 5/29, 6/5) **CONT. TO 6/26**

Proposal would extend \$10,000 reward for information leading to arrest/conviction of person(s) responsible for 2004 murder of Samuel Williams III, who was shot on porch on W. 108<sup>th</sup> Street in unincorporated area near Los Angeles. (Items 14) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Yvonne B. Burke recommends extension of \$25,000 reward for information leading to arrest/conviction of person(s) responsible for 2007 murder of 18-month-old Qristyonn Augustine and the wounding of Hollis Roberts in southeast Los Angeles. (Items 15)  
**APPROVED**

Proposal would increase reward amount offered by the Board to \$10,000, and extend rewards for period not to exceed 180 days. (Items 19, 111) **APPROVED**

Proposal would transfer responsibility of the Long Beach Superior Court and title to Long Beach Courthouse to the State of California, effective July 1, as part of the legislation approved in 1997 transferring obligation for funding of court operations from the counties to the state. (Item 20)  
**APPROVED**

\$2.2 million proposal would fund redesign/refurbishment of County Counsel's offices in the Hall of Administration. (Item 32) **APPROVED**

Board asked to approve conditional use permit allowing construction of 70-unit low-income apartment complex and childcare facility in Compton. (Items 33, 114) **APPROVED**

Proposal would clarify roles the Regional Planning Commission and Design Control Board play during site plan approval process for Marina del Rey development projects. (Item 34)  
**APPROVED**

Permission sought to apply for \$85,000 grant to help finance construction of replacement fence at the South Coast Botanic Gardens in effort to prevent vandalism. (Item 57) **APPROVED**

Acceptance of maximum \$43,750 grant would fund program with City of Los Angeles to reduce gang /criminal involvement by pregnant juveniles in Boyle Heights. (Item 63) **APPROVED**

\$9.5 million proposal would fund construction of new fire station in Palmdale. (Item 67)  
**APPROVED**

\$332,000 proposal would fund acquisition of property along San Jose Creek in Pomona for new railway track construction as part of the Temple Avenue Train Diversion Project in effort to eliminate railway crossings at Temple Avenue and Pomona Boulevard. (Item 69) **APPROVED**

\$2.2 million proposal would fund various projects at Schabarum Park in Rowland Heights, including bridge replacement, construction of horse staging area and replacement of play area. (Item 72) **APPROVED**

Proposal would approve the design-build contracting process for the implementation of the \$344 million Harbor-UCLA Medical Center surgery/emergency replacement project. (Item 73)  
**PUBLIC WORKS CONT. TO 6/26**

\$993,634 proposal would fund construction of the Acton Park Phase II project, which includes a softball field, gazebo/community pavilion, and landscaping, and set July 11 for bid opening. (Item 75) **APPROVED**

Proposal calls for increasing rental rates of hangars and tie-downs at County-owned airports. (Item 93) **APPROVED**

Acceptance of \$700,000 grant from Metropolitan Transit Authority would reimburse the County for cost incurred in 2006-07 for providing transportation tokens to indigents. (Item 94)  
**APPROVED**

Board asked to approve Secretary of State's request to test security of County's voting equipment. (Item 101, cont. from 6/12) **YAROSLAVSKY CONT. 2 WEEKS**

Acceptance of \$100,000 grant would fund hiring of consultant to develop plan to reduce the recidivism rate of parolees going to back to prison. (Item 103) **APPROVED**

\$200,000 settlement proposed for man who was injured in a car accident involving a Sheriff's Department employee. (Item 109) **APPROVED**

Supervisors asked to approve affordable housing policy guidelines for Marina del Rey. (Item 115, cont. from 5/1, 5/15, 6/12) **APPROVED WITH KNABE AMENDMENT TO SET GOALS FOR NEW DEVELOPMENT AT 5% FOR LOW INCOME AND 5% FOR MODERATE INCOME FAMILIES**
