Board meets in closed session to get update on search for candidates for new chief executive officer. (CS-6) **NO REPORTABLE ACTION**

Long Beach Wilson Classical High School boys baseball team honored for winning CIF Southern Section Division I championship and national championship.

Supervisor Yvonne B. Burke presents scroll to 106-year-old man believed to be the oldest person in her district.

Sheriff reports on the early release of Paris Hilton, including the reasons for not placing her in an appropriate jail ward medical facility. (Item S-1, noon, cont. from 6/19) **RECEIVED AND FILED**

Proposal calls for increasing garbage rates in Belvedere District by \$40 to \$192. (Item 1) **APPROVED**

Supervisors vote to transfer Amigo County Park in Whittier area to Fourth District from First District. (Item 3) **APPROVED**

Amendments proposed to zoning code to establish development standards to maintain low densities, secluded rural character and significant natural resources in Juniper Hills, Littlerock and Sun Village. (Items 11 and 12) **APPROVED**

Supervisor Michael D. Antonovich recommends that Board deputies be included in all “cluster” meetings of departments held by the new Chief Executive Office and that all such meetings be subject to Brown Act. (Items 20 and 21, cont. from 5/29, 6/5, 6/19) **RECEIVED AND FILED, TO BE REVIEWED IN SIX MONTHS, 4-1, WITH ANTONOVICH OPPOSED**

Supervisor Don Knabe proposes \$25,000 reward for information leading to arrest/conviction of person(s) responsible for June 12 murder of Michael Paul Miller on the Long Beach Freeway. (Item 23) **APPROVED**

Recommendation calls for county property on E. 120th Street in Los Angeles area be provided without cost for up to 10 years to AIDS Project Los Angeles for dental clinic and food pantry. (Item 26) **APPROVED**

Proposal would extend \$10,000 reward for information leading to arrest/conviction of person(s)

responsible for 2005 murder of Cedric Smalls in unincorporated area near Los Angeles.(Item 27)

APPROVED

Proposal would approve the design-build contracting process for the implementation of the \$344 million Harbor-UCLA Medical Center surgery/emergency replacement project. (Item 44, cont. from 6/19) **APPROVED**

\$20.87 million budget proposed for construction of Centinela Area Probation Office and Building and Safety Firestone District Office. (Item 46) **APPROVED**

\$88.5 million construction contract proposed for Big Tujunga Dam seismic rehabilitation and spillway modification project. (Item 48) **APPROVED**

Board asked to approve Secretary of State's request to test security of County's voting equipment. (Item 50, cont. from 6/12 and 6/19) **YAROSLAVSKY CONT. 1 WEEK**

City of West Hollywood donates \$80,000 to remodel and provide equipment to West Hollywood Sheriff's Station dispatch center. (Item 53) **APPROVED**

Contingency plans to be discussed in the event King-Harbor Hospital does not meet federal standards. (Item 56) **MOTION APPROVED TO ENDORSE IN PRINCIPLE THE CONTINGENCY PLAN PRESENTED BY HEALTH DEPARTMENT; ORDERED HEALTH DEPARTMENT TO BEGIN CONTINGENCY PREPARATIONS SHOULD HOSPITAL HAVE TO CLOSE**

Supervisors asked to approve child welfare waiver demonstration project implementation plan. (Item 57-B) **APPROVED 5-0 WITH AMENDMENT**
