Nov. 9

Board meets in closed session at 8 a.m. to interview candidates for county counsel. **NO REPORTABLE ACTION**

Nov. 10

Lois Hunter and Robert Dominguez honored for being selected by the American High School Theatre Festival to represent the United States in co-directing 33 students in a production of the critically acclaimed musical Runaways at the Edinburgh Festival in Scotland.

Board bestows title of honorary consul general to the moon to astronaut Buzz Aldrin.

Report to be given on issues relating to transition to new LAC+USC Medical Center. (Item S-1, 11 a.m.) **MOLINA CONT. TO 11/17**

In effort to help ailing hotel industry, Supervisor Don Knabe requests Board urge the federal government to reconsider its methodology in setting per diem hotel rates in L.A County. (Item 3) **APPROVED**

Board asks for report in 30 days on proposed program to do background checks on all County contractors, including whether they are involved in any lawsuits. (Item 6) **ANTONOVICH CONT. TO 11/24**

Supervisors Mark Ridley-Thomas and Michael D. Antonovich request County apply for \$40 million in federal stimulus funds, adopt policy initiatives and seek legislation to support better nutrition, physical activity and smoking prevention programs. (Item 7) **RIDLEY-THOMAS CONT. TO 11/17**

Responding to inadequate number of medical personnel to assist uninsured and under-insured persons seeking treatment during August event at Coliseum, recommendation seeks state

legislation to allow out-of-state licensed medical personnel to provide volunteer services for short periods of time for activities sponsored by non-profit or local community groups. (Item 8) **APPROVED**

Proposal calls for new ordinance to regulate wireless telecommunication facilities that would give County maximum amount of discretion for controversial cases while streamlining non-controversial ones. (Item 9) **APPROVED**

Recommendation would approve 10-year lease and expansion of the Lake Los Angeles Library at cost of \$611,500. (Item 13) **APPROVED**

Board considers appeal of Regional Planning Commission's denial of continued operation of motel in East Pasadena that neighbors had complained contributed to prostitution in area, and housed sex offenders and parolees. (Item 17) **APPROVED**

\$498,000 proposal would fund reconfiguration of office space for Treasurer and Tax Collector at the Hall of Administration in downtown Los Angeles, and replacement of heating and irrigations systems at the Public Administrator warehouse in Industry. (Item18) **APPROVED**

Acceptance of \$2.1 million in federal stimulus funds would fund nutrition and employment services for older workers who have poor job prospects. (Item 21) **APPROVED**

Proposal would grant maximum \$5.62 million annually to St. Francis Medical Center for trauma care for persons living in area that would have been served by King-Harbor Hospital. (Item 23) **APPROVED**

\$1.4 million proposal would fund Athens Park Community Center renovation and tennis court replacement project in Los Angeles. (Items 32, 33) **APPROVED**

Board asked to approve proposal to provide fire/paramedic service to the City of Brea in Orange County. (Item 42) **MOLINA CONT. TO 11/24**

Board asked to approve acceptance of the following grants:

- \$350,000 for gang violence suppression program in Antelope Valley. (Item 43) **APPROVED**
- \$200,000 for equipment to implement Automatic License Plate Recognition System to aid in investigating crimes, improve homeland security, and locate wanted persons and stolen vehicles. (Item 44) **APPROVED**

\$274,000 proposal would purchase mobile command post emergency vehicle to deploy gang enforcement personnel nightly in targeted areas. (Item 46) **RIDLEY-THOMAS CONT. TO 11/24**

\$2.85 million settlement proposed in lawsuit filed by Arleen Griffith for injuries received in automobile accident involving an employee of the Department of Agricultural Commissioner/Weights and Measures. (Item 48) **APPROVED**

Reports scheduled on efforts to reduce risk management and legal costs. (Items 55-59)**CEO CONT. TO 11/17**

Development of plan requested to continue meeting needs of youth receiving emancipated youth stipends and independent living services, in light of state funding cuts. (Item 61-A)
