RE: Transfer of care to new physician in County of Los Angeles/CorVel MPN for your workplace Injury.

Dear Injured worker,

Your current treating physician for the above referenced work related injury, is not a participating provider in the current County of Los Angeles/CorVel MPN, administered by CorVel Healthcare Corporation. Based on our review of your current medical condition and consistent with the "Transfer of Ongoing Care" policy (which is enclosed) we have determined that your injury or illness does not meet one of the four conditions that would allow you to continue to treat with current treating physician.

The four conditions which are defined in detail in the attached "Transfer of Ongoing Care" policy are:

1. An acute condition
2. A serious chronic condition
3. A terminal illness
4. Performance of a surgery or other procedure authorized by the insurer or employer as a part of a documented course of treatment and has been recommended or documented by the provider to occur within 180 days of MPN effective date.

Because your injury or illness does not meet any of the conditions, you will continue your treatment through a medical provider in the CorVel MPN. You may access a listing of potential providers by visiting this website: <http://www.CorVel.com/>

If you dispute the medical determination that you do not meet one of the four conditions, and the resultant transfer of ongoing care into the County of Los Angeles/CorVel MPN, you must request a report from your primary physician that addresses whether you fall within any of the conditions. Your treating physician has 20 days from the date of your request to give you a copy of his/her medical report regarding your condition. If your primary treating physician does not give you the report within 20 days of your request, your employer or the insurer can transfer your ongoing care and you will be required to use a medical care provider within the County of Los Angeles/CorVel MPN.

You will need to give a copy of the medical report to your employer if you wish to postpone the transfer of your care into the MPN. If you or your employer disagrees with your doctor's report regarding your condition, you or your employer can dispute it as set forth in the enclosed policy.
