

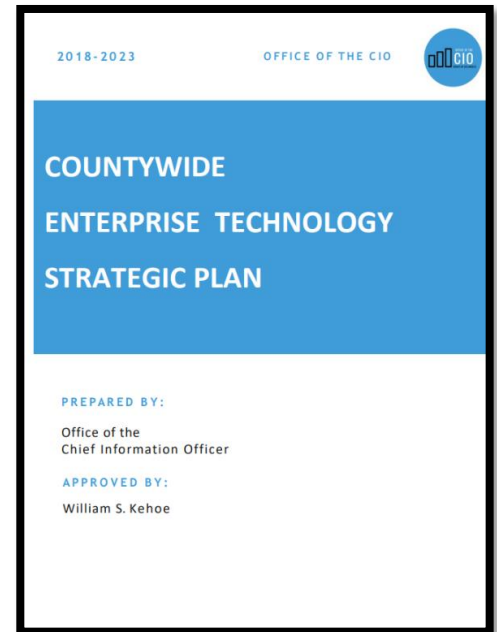
## 5-year Countywide Enterprise Strategic Plan is Live!

The Office of the CIO (OCIO) has prepared and released a 5-year Countywide Enterprise Strategic Plan that can be found at our [OCIO website](#), SharePoint and our social media platforms. This plan was developed in collaboration with over 200+ business and IT leadership from all 37 County departments and built on the premise that technology strategy must align and enable enterprise and department service strategies.

CIO William (Bill) Kehoe states, “We believe these goals are relevant, dynamic, inclusive, and actionable and we are excited to see the initiatives that the goal teams will bring forward and the impact they will have internally with our employees and with the public.”

Our current team leads have been working on developing each of these goals by meeting regularly to establish goal measures, initiatives, and track progress then relaying that information to our Technology Management & Business Management Council members for their insight and perspective.

## Technology & Business Management Council



The Office of the CIO is assisting departments in embracing the mobility culture by utilizing our IT Enterprise Governance Technology Management Council (TMC) & Business Management Council (BMC) convenings.

Together, we created a virtually interactive platform to push beyond the boundaries of 2020 and help departments become future ready by reviewing their Mobility Journey. ## Enterprise Architecture

The Enterprise Architecture (EA) program at Los Angeles County is focused on building awareness of enterprise processes and technology across all County departments. EA will be publishing a set of principles to the TMC and BMC in February that OCIO will use during project evaluation to help evaluate County projects and technology to align with the County Strategic Plan and align with long-term portfolio improvement.

EA has recently created team clusters (EATC) with representatives from ten different departments that meet monthly to discuss a wide variety of topics. Recent meetings have had exciting cross-department discussions on technology options for new projects being defined by an individual department, education opportunities to foster a common understanding of technology and presented compelling alternatives to the traditional requirements gathering session. These groups are growing and EA invites members from all departments – both technical and business.
