



By: August 9th

Only Time-Sensitive Proposals

Analysis of the fiscal, programmatic, and service impact to the County & statewide

Explanation of existing law & Issue

Clear nexus to a policy or budget issue that requires legislative action in 2022

Things to Keep in Mind as You Build Your Proposal



<u>Prioritize proposals</u> if submitting more than one.



<u>Vet</u> potential fiscal impact(s) with your CEO Budget Analyst.



Obtain concurrence if it affects other departments.



Work with County
Counsel to write bill language.



Be prepared to participate in the Legislative Process,

including being ready to answer on-going questions, and testify at committee hearings as needed.

County-Sponsored Proposal Process

Determining what and what not to sponsor

CEO-LAIR conducts a thorough review of all submitted proposals for County sponsorship.



Works with the Board offices and others to recommend those proposals that are of the County's <u>highest</u> priority.

County-Sponsored Proposal

What happens next?



CEO-LAIR issues a
Sacramento Update to
the Board identifying the
major proposals the
County will sponsor based
on existing policy.

What if there is no existing policy to pursue the proposal?



Addition of a new policy to the State Legislative Agenda is required potentially via Board motion.

Mr. MORELLE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution: which was referred to the House Calcurlar and ordered to be printed

- Distinguishing an HR (House of Representatives) bill from a House Resolution and an S (Senate) bill from a Senate Resolution
 - Bills are prefixed with "H.R." when introduced in the House and "S." when introduced in the Senate; they are followed by a number based on the order in which they are introduced. The vast majority of legislative proposals are in the form of bills.
 - Simple resolutions are designated H.Res. and S.Res., followed by a number. A simple resolution addresses matters entirely within the prerogative of one house, such as revising the standing rules of one Chamber. Simple resolutions are also used to express the sentiments of a single house.
