Below is an update on Federal and State legislative items of interest to the County of Los Angeles.



The next regularly scheduled Board of Supervisors meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 12th, at 9:30 a.m.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The County is advocating on the following bills:

FEDERAL

SUPPORT H.R. 3194 (SANCHEZ) - U.S. CITIZENSHIP ACT

Support <u>H.R. 3194</u>, which would provide an earned path to citizenship for undocumented individuals, address the root causes of migration, manage the southern border, and reform the immigrant visa system.

STATE

• <u>CHANGE OF COUNTY ADVOCACY POSITION FROM OPPOSE TO NEUTRAL - ASSEMBLY BILL (AB) 426 (JACKSON) - UNLICENSED RESIDENTIAL FOSTER CARE FACILITIES</u>

The September 1, 2023, amendments to <u>AB 426</u> addressed the concerns the County raised about this bill undermining counties' statutory role in administering the child welfare program. Therefore, the County will remove its oppose position and take a neutral position on this bill.

2023 County-Sponsored Legislation

We continue to work with members of the Legislature to advocate for passage of the following County-sponsored bills.




AB 875 (Gabriel) - Tracking Unlawful Detainer Data to Improve Eviction Prevention Services. This co-sponsored bill would direct trial courts to provide the Judicial Council of California with specified anonymous data on unlawful detainer cases. This data would allow policy makers and service providers to more effectively plan and implement eviction prevention and defense programs, and help keep vulnerable people in their homes, reducing inflows into homelessness.

<u>AB 1512 (Bryan)</u> - Foster Care Payments. This co-sponsored bill would amend the law to ensure that conserving youths' Social Security Administration (SSA) benefits becomes the standard practice in Los Angeles County and throughout the state of California.
