COUNTY ADVOCACY ACTIONS


At the February 6th meeting, the Board of Supervisors took the following actions:

• **SUPPORT FOR SENATE BILL (SB) 915 (CORTESE): PRIORITIZING LOCAL CONTROL IN THE DEPLOYMENT OF AUTONOMOUS VEHICLE SERVICES**

The Board directed the Chief Executive Office – Legislative Affairs and Intergovernmental Relations (CEO-LAIR) to express support for SB 915, legislation which would prioritize local control for the deployment of autonomous vehicle services. Additional details on the motion can be found [here](#).

• **SUPPORT FOR THE PRESERVATION OF REAP 2.0 FUNDING**

LOS ANGELES COUNTY TAKING FIRST STEPS TOWARD RECOVERY AFTER WINTER STORMS

Los Angeles County is preparing to begin the initial activities to support residents with their individual recovery efforts following the recent storms. Identifying recovery activities is a critical step in setting a solid roadmap for how our residents, jurisdictions, and County get back to normal after any disaster.

The first step in the process is for individuals and businesses to complete a Damage Collection Survey to answer preliminary questions regarding any damage that was sustained from the recent storms. The County's Recovery page for the 2024 storms will serve as a resource library for all post-disaster information. Residents are encouraged to visit the website regularly for the most up-to-date information regarding recovery activities. For assistance in completing the survey, residents can call 2-1-1.
