Below is an update on Federal and State legislative items of interest to the County of Los Angeles.



At the March 6th meeting, the Board of Supervisors took the following action:

#### • SUPPORT FOR H.R. 7038 (R. GARCIA): GUARANTEED INCOME FOR FOSTER YOUTH ACT



The Board directed the Chief Executive Office – Legislative Affairs and Intergovernmental Relations (CEO-LAIR) to support <u>H.R. 7038</u>, legislation that would create a new Federal program to provide \$1,000 a month for five years to young adults exiting foster care. #### **FEDERAL**

#### SUPPORT H.R. 7010 (CHU): INCREASING ACCESS TO FOSTER CARE THROUGH <u>AGE 21 ACT</u>

<u>H.R. 7010</u> would provide an incentive for states to extend child welfare support and services for youth through 21 years of age, and allow youth to re-enter foster care after attaining 18 years of age, both without regard to the Aid to Families with Dependent Children eligibility of their parents or legal guardians. #### SUPPORT H.R. 7024 (SMITH): TAX RELIEF FOR AMERICAN FAMILIES AND WORKERS ACT OF 2024



<u>H.R. 7024</u> contains provisions to increase and modify the child tax credit and enhance the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit. Additional details regarding this bill are available <u>here</u>.



H.R. 7070 would direct and require that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) make several changes to guidance and project prioritization for wildfire response, mitigation, and remediation projects. Additional details regarding this bill are available here.

#### • SUPPORT ASSEMBLY BILL (AB) 1957 (WILSON): **BEST VALUE** CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTING FOR COUNTIES

AB 1957 would extend the Best Value Construction Contracting for Counties (BVCC) Pilot Program to all counties and remove the January 1, 2025, sunset date. Additional details regarding this bill are available here.

#### • SUPPORT AB 2285 (RENDON): ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION: 30X30 **GOAL: URBAN NATURE-BASED INVESTMENTS: PARITY**

AB 2285 would encourage the Governor's office, State agencies, and the Legislature, when distributing resources towards conservation and restoration goals during future budgetary deliberations, to ensure parity in allocations toward urban nature-based investments. #### SUPPORT AB 2346 (LEE): PROCUREMENT OF RECOVERED ORGANIC WASTE PRODUCTS

AB 2346 would increase the use of organic waste by providing organic waste reduction flexibilities including credits to local jurisdictions for the procurement of recovered organic waste products through an agreement with a direct service provider, adding three categories of gualified compost, and extending credit for organic waste reduction investments to 2030. #### <u>SUPPORT SENATE BILL (SB) 1143 (ALLEN): HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS</u> WASTE: PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY

<u>SB 1143</u> would direct and require CalRecycle to develop a comprehensive extended producer responsibility program for common household hazardous waste. Additional details regarding this bill are available here.

## GREENLINE HOME PROGRAM: GRANTS FOR FIRST-TIME HOMEBUYERS

The Department of Consumer and Business Affairs and the LA County Center for Financial Empowerment have launched the County of Los Angeles Greenline Home Program which aims to tackle the legacy of redlining. # <u>Free Tax Prep LA</u>: A trustworthy and stress-free way to file your taxes!



Free Tax Prep Los Angeles (FTPLA) or Volunteer Tax Assistance (VITA) Program, has been available to residents and families for over a decade and has offered free tax help to people who need assistance in preparing their tax returns. IRS-certified volunteers provide free basic income tax return preparation with electronic filing to qualified individuals.

- If you make less than \$30,950 annually, you may qualify for even more money on your refund through the Cal EITC.
