COUNTY ADVOCACY- RELATED ACTIONS

At the February 11th and February 18th meetings, the Board of Supervisors took the following legislative-related actions:

Support for Support for Assembly Bill (AB) 299 (Gabriel/Rivas): Motels, Hotels, and Short-Term Lodging: Los Angeles County: Wildfires

The Board directed the Chief Executive Office – Legislative Affairs and Intergovernmental Relations (CEO-LAIR), to take all appropriate legislative advocacy actions to support <u>AB 299</u>, including, but not limited to, sending a fivesignature letter in support of the bill to Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel and Assembly Speaker Robert Rivas. Under AB 299, continued occupancy of a guest of a motel, hotel, or short-term lodging, as defined, would not constitute a new tenancy if the guest is living in the motel, hotel, or short-term lodging as a result of losing their residence in a wildfire in the County of Los Angeles. Support for AB 311 (McKinnor/Rivas): Dwelling Units: Persons at Risk of Homelessness

The Board directed CEO-LAIR, to support <u>AB 311</u>, legislation which would allow a tenant and landlord to temporarily house a person, family, and/or pet displaced by a declared state of emergency without granting that person full tenancy status or amending the lease including. Advocacy includes, but is not limited to, sending a five-signature letter in support of the bill to Assemblymember Tina McKinnor and Assembly Speaker Robert Rivas. <u>Support for AB 380 (Gonzalez): Price Gouging</u>

The Board directed CEO-LAIR, to take all appropriate legislative advocacy actions to support <u>AB 380</u>, including, but not limited to, sending a five-signature letter in support of the bill to the author, Assemblymember Mark González. AB 380 would extend price gouging protections on hotels, food, and other essential goods and services for the full duration of an emergency declaration to safeguard Angelenos from predatory price gouging during times of crisis. Los Angeles County Early Care and Education Child Care Windstorm and Wildfire Recovery Efforts

The Board directed CEO-LAIR, to support State budget proposals, legislation and other administrative efforts to meet the needs of childcare providers affected by the wildfires including, but not limited to, health and safety assessments and remediation for childcare facilities. LA County Household Relief Grant

Beginning February 26, eligible households will be able to apply for grants ranging from \$6,000 to \$18,000, depending on household size and composition. Funds can be used for essential expenses such as: housing and living costs; funeral expenses; and repairs not covered by other forms of assistance. The fund will distribute \$32.2 million in relief through the <u>grant program</u> which will be administered by the Department of Consumer and Business Affairs in partnership with The Center by Lendistry.
