Additionally, I sit on the SouthBay and Foothill Workforce Investment Boards.

Long Beach Mayors Ernie Kell and Beverly O'Neill had both appointed me to the Long Beach Electrician Examining Board. Long Beach Mayor Bob Foster appointed me to the Pacific Gateway WIB. Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia appointed me as a Planning Commissioner in 2014, where I still serve.

I feel it is very important to be an advocate and mentor for women and men in all areas. I continue to work for future equality.
